 Arrive at school everyday on time; Come to school regularly. School starts at 8.30am. Present myself well in full school uniform and follow our uniform rules in regards to Jewellery. Understand that when I am in uniform I am representing the school; Be punctual and correctly equipped for all lessons. Be ready to learn. Be respectful- Respond positive to staff on first request. Keep each other safe- walk calmly around the school and keep your hands to yourself. We are a 'hands off' school. Be successful by following our school moto of 'Believe to Achieve'. Work hard to achieve target grades; complete work/homework on time and meet deadlines. Be tolerant and respectful to others and their property. Be an ambassador for the school at all times both in and out of school; Strive for the highest standard in all areas of school life and beyond the school gates. 	 Ensure that my child goes to school regularly, wearing the correct uniform, is on time and correctly equipped. School starts at 8.30am. Let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect my child's work or behaviour Fully support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour; Including after school detentions, so there is consistency between home and school. Support my child with homework. 	 Praise and Reward students who are upholding our school values of Courage, Compassion and Commitment. Contact parents/carers if there is a problem with attendance, punctuality or uniform/equipment. Let parents/carers know about any concerns or problems that affect their child's academic progression or behaviour. Provide a rigorous and balanced curriculum. Encourage good behaviour, for example through: PSHE, the pastoral system; the Anti-

- Look out for our Churchmead community and be kind to all.
- Try a range of extra-curricular activities in and out of school and honour commitments by taking part in these activities and attend practices/rehearsals (e.g. teams, plays, concerts)
- Support my Year Group, my House and my School to the best of my ability.
- Understand that poor behaviour and attendance will have an impact on my own achievements and opportunities.
- To never bring banned items onto the school grounds (for example energy drinks or vapes) and to uphold the behaviour policy.
- To understand that at Churchmead School have a zero-tolerance policy on mobile phones. If they are seen out during lessons or out and about within school they can be confiscated.

- Attend Progress evenings and discussions about my child's progress.
- Avoid family holidays during term time.
- Get to know about my child's life at the school.
- Be responsible for my child's social media usage and monitor this regularly.
- Understand that appointments with staff should be made in advance and in school working hours as they cannot usually be available for meetings without notice.
- Permit the administration of analgesics (paracetamol) to my child if a first-aid trained staff members considers this appropriate.

- Plan teaching so that the needs of each child are met.
- Send home regular reports on each child's progress.
- Set and monitor homework and provide facilities for children to complete homework in school;
