Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award

Our second group of students from Year 9 and Year 12 took part in their Duke Of Edinburgh Bronze Award Expedition this term, across the Chiltern Hills.



The weekend involved orienteering, setting up their own tents, working as a team, planning meals and cooking them on camping stoves and hiking, all without the use of electronics.



Students have spent the past six months planning and training to complete a two day (one night) outdoor expedition which took place around Gerrards Cross in May, plus three months of volunteering and improving a skill.



The Duke of Edinburgh Award, founded by the late Prince Philip in 1957, involves a set of challenges for young people to help their community and environment, increase fitness, develop new skills and complete an independent outdoors expedition. It is a voluntary, non competitive and flexible programme of cultural and adventurous activities.

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Science Earth Models

Our Year 7 Science students have been busy creating models showing the earth's layers this term. They used a variety of different methods and worked on their projects throughout the term.



Geography visit to Hengistbury Head

Our Year 10 Geographers spent the day at Hengistbury Head in Dorset earlier this term, testing their fieldwork skills on the beach. They spent the day measuring long shore drift and looked at the impact of coastal defences. This was all great preparation for their fieldwork exam in Year 11.



RE Trip to Slough Gurdwara

Our Year 8 RE students were invited to the Guru Maneyo Gurdwara in Slough to learn about the Sikh faith. They learnt about the Sikh identity and commitments and took part in a Langar, which is a shared meal.



Harry Potter Studios Tour

Our Film Studies students took a trip to the Harry Potter Studios this term to find out more about Mise-en-Scene (which means everything that is within the frame), which they have been learning about in class this term.



Students got to experience first hand how the Harry Potter franchise intentionally created the magical world of Hogwarts and beyond in the films, studying specific scenes and characters.



Students were able to discuss costume design, hair and makeup, prop making and set design with experts who had worked on the films. They got to see the actual sets and costumes that were used in the films up close as well as lots of behind the scenes film making information.



The group took part in an activity to create their own storyboard, creating a scene for a film they devised, even bringing them to life using green screen technology.



Your child will be eligible for Free School Meals if you get any of these benefits:

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment & Support Allowance
- Support under V1 of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of state pension credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,900
- Working Tax Credit "run on" - the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credits

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



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
