School success starts with attendance



#### Attendance - Aspire to 100% - 97%

Pupils with attendance of <u>99% or above</u> generally achieve <u>at least</u>
 <u>1 grade above</u> their target grade.

• Pupils with good attendance <u>feel more connected with friendship</u> groups and the wider community.

 Pupils with regular attendance at school are more likely to be successful at A level, University and apprenticeship interviews.



#### **Attendance at School**

100% = No day absent from school (September to July)

95% = 10 days absence from school (September to July)

90% = 20 days absence from school (September to July)

85% = 30 days absence from school (September to July)

80% = 40 days absence from school (September to July)






## Important information about Year 10

**Exam Board: Edexcel.** There are lots of past papers and resources on the website.

Key messages: 4 exam papers (two language and two Literature)

- GCSE English <u>Language</u> and <u>English Literature</u> 2 GCSEs
- The spoken language in the English Language exam will be marked as a pass, merit or distinction and internally assessed and moderated by the exam board.
- There are a lot of texts and skills covered, so attendance and work ethic are extremely important. Any time missed will be detrimental to the progress that a student can make.
- Because of the amount of content, the homework has been designed to help students revise
  and consolidate the knowledge and skills they need for both GCSEs. It is important that the
  homework is completed as fully as possible.

**Exam Board: Edexcel** 

Key messages: 3 papers (one non-calculator and two calculator)

- Focus on the topics that have already been covered.
- Use the QLA (Question, Learning and Analysis sheets) to identify what area your weakness is in and revise these topics first.
- It would be useful to buy either foundation of higher revision guide for Edexcel.
- Start revision now- flash cards are very helpful within Maths.





#### Science

**Exam Board:** AQA Syllabus and are all preparing for Combine Science

Key messages: 6 papers (covering all topics)

- At the end of the course, each student will be awarded 2 GCSEs –
   Combined Biology, Chemistry, Physics
- For each discipline they have been issued with a pack which outlines lesson by lesson the work which is to be covered in the term as well as homework. Each pack becomes a working revision guide.
- Should a student miss the lesson for whatever reason they must catch up with the work outlined at their earliest convenience.

#### Religious Studies

Exam Board: AQA- Religious Studies A Christianity and Islam

Key messages: 2 papers (one Religion paper and one Themes paper)



- Revise early, every bit of revision you do this year: making revision notes, revision cards, mind maps, key term lists and religious teaching lists will make your life so much easier next year. It will give you the foundation to get the higher grades.
- Advised to buy the Revision Guide Religious Studies A Christianity and Islam (£9.99 on Amazon)
- Practice the 12 Mark Questions written in the FARC (For, Against, Religious teaching, Conclusion) Structure.
- Come and talk to Mr Kingsley-Jones about the grade that you would like to get in RE. He wants 100% of you to get at least a grade 5 (good pass). He will work hard for you in school but you need to make the same effort at home in your own revision.

#### Why is it Important to Revise Now?

- 66% of material is forgotten after 7 days
- 88% of material is forgotten after 6 weeks
- Revision is most effective when you study for periods of 35/40 minutes and then take a 10 minute break.
- Reading notes and text books leads to a mere 10% retention.

## Get organised-Independent Study

- Create a quiet and suitable place to study outside of school
- Have the equipment you need
- Allocate time in the family schedule for self study and revision
- Have suitable breaks






#### **Revision Sessions**

- ✓ Use these folders to **organise** your exam papers and revision












## Revision sessions: past papers and questions

#### **Post it Notes**




- ✓ **Use post it** notes to identify areas that you are unsure of or have not understood in class




#### Question and answer cards






# Mind mapping




Time lines and flow diagrams
