<p>Open with two or three rhetorical questions that grab your audience's attention.</p>	
<p>Introduce your topic and highlight/outline what you will be talking about.</p>	
<p>The main part of your speech.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Use interesting facts. ➤ State how these facts make you feel. ➤ Consider the other side of the argument and prove that it is wrong! <p>Constructing a good speech: Firstly/Secondly/Finally However On the other hand In addition to Furthermore Although</p>	
<p>Anecdote Speak about a personal story that involved you/someone you know. How did you/that person feel? Did it change their life? You can use a well-known story or make one up (it does not have to be true!)</p>	
<p>Conclude your speech by summing up everything you have spoken about.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Give your own thoughts and feelings on the topic and explain why you feel this way. 	
<p>Leave your audience with something to think about. Consider using:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Facts. ➤ Questions. ➤ A statement to ponder.
