Use this as a guide for your annotations

You want to be writing purposeful annotations – you are not just filling space on you slides.

Annotation - what is it?

Remember: To be clear, precise and straight to the point. Make sure you also check your spelling and that it makes sense! It is a written explanation that communicates your thoughts on a piece of work. It is a critique and reflection on your work and assessing own progress throughout a project.

Annotation should include:

- □ Relevant and purposeful language.
- □ A reflection on the progress you have made.
- □ Clarify what you have done and why you have done it.
- □ Analyse the success of the idea highlight areas of strength.
- □ Address weaknesses and establish next steps.
- □ Explain links to a specific artist or designer and how they have influenced you.
- □ Explain your thoughts about an idea and the link to the theme.
- □ Acknowledge the decision-making process throughout.

□ Use keywords and terminology that communicate your understanding.



Tip: Think about what you have done, why you have done it and what you have learnt.



Select your most recent piece of work. Write an annotation answering the following questions:

- What is it? What does it mean/symbolise? Why have you created it? What is its purpose?
- □ Who or what is the subject and why?
- ❑ What do you want people to think/feel or how do you want them to react when they look at it?
- What artist/s have you linked your work to? Have you connected it to a particular time, period, culture or theme? How have you documented this in your own outcome?
- □ What is the significance of the composition of the image/s, viewpoint/background or foreground, etc.?
- □ How are the formal elements used?
- □ What has worked well and why?
- □ What could be further improved or developed? How are you going to achieve this?

Tip: Pick out the strengths of the annotation and be specific about what needs to be improved.
