#### **Key Terms**


- Sanctity of life: all life is holy as it is crated and loved by God; Christians believe human life should not be misused or abused.
- Quality of life: the general well-being of a person, in relation to their health and happiness; also, the theory that the value of life depends upon how good or how satisfying it is.
- Abortion: the removal of a foetus from the womb to end a pregnancy, usually before the foetus is 24 weeks old.
- Conception when the sperm meets the egg.
- Foetus when the unborn baby looks human.
- Embryo earliest stages of pregnancy. Baby does not look human yet.
- Contraception method used to stop someone becoming pregnant.

#### **Abortion Act of 1967**

#### What the Act actually stated

The Abortion Act of 1967 revolutionised the situation in England by allowing doctors to perform an abortion where two other doctors agree: "that the continuance of the pregnancy would involve risk to the life of the pregnant woman, or of injury to the physical or mental health of the pregnant woman or any existing children of her family, greater than if the pregnancy were terminated"

or

"that there is a substantial risk that if the child were born it would suffer from such physical or mental abnormalities as to be seriously handicapped."

#### **History On Abortion**

Abortion is the removal of a foetus from the womb to end a pregnancy before the child is born. This happens naturally when a woman has a miscarriage, but abortion usually refers to the deliberate termination of a pregnancy through a medical procedure.

Before 1967 abortion was illegal in the UK. It is now allowed up to the 24<sup>th</sup> week of pregnancy in a licensed clinic if two doctors agree that one of the following conditions applies:

- The woman's life is in danger if the pregnancy continues.
- There is a risk to the woman's physical and mental health.
- There is a significant risk that the baby will be born wit severe physical or mental disabilities.
- An additional child may affect the physical or mental health of existing children in the family.

There is no time limit if the mother's life is in danger or if the foetus is severely deformed. The number of legal abortions carried out by doctors in England and Wales in 2014 was 184,571.



#### Pro-choice Vs. Pro-life

#### **FOR**

Pro-choice is a term to describe that it is the woman's right to choose what happens to her body. Pro-Choice supports the woman's right to abortion before the foetus' right to life.

#### **AGAINST**

Pro-life is a term representing that the unborn child needs protection and its right to life comes before the rights of the woman.

#### **PRO-CHOICE**

Why should a woman have free choice about abortion?

- Every woman has the right to do as she wishes with her body!
- A baby has the right to be born into a loving and caring family who can provide basic needs.

- A woman who is raped should not be compelled to have the rapist's baby.



#### **Buddhist Views on Abortion**

- In general, abortion is seen as a form of killing which goes against the first moral precept and so is unskilful.
- However, Buddhists may sometimes favour abortion, such as when the baby is likely to be born with a serious disability, or have a poor quality of life.
- Some Buddhists believe that deciding to have an abortion is a question of personal choice.
- Buddhist views on abortion differ from country to country depending on social norms and traditions.
