CHURCHTOWN PRIMARY SCHOOL

Changes to Admissions Arrangements for 2025-26

The Trustees of Endeavour Learning Trust would like to give notice of proposed changes to the Admission Policy for Churchtown Primary School, which will apply from the 2025-26 academic year and thereafter, subject to any further consultation.

The draft policy for consultation can be viewed on the Local Authority (Sefton Council) (https://www.sefton.gov.uk/schooladmissionspolicyandreports), as they will be coordinating the consultation on our behalf or a hard copy is available on request from the individual school reception.

Proposed Admissions Policy 2025-2026

The main changes in this revised Admissions Policy are:

- Reduction of PAN to 90 pupils.
 <u>Rationale</u>: School built initially for three form (90) entry and the average admissions for the last three years has been 80 pupils.
- Removal of the oversubscription criterion regarding school staff.
 <u>Rationale</u>: This criterion is removed to ensure parity across the other Trust schools and has not been active at Churchtown in the last three years.
- Inclusion of oversubscription criterion regarding children with proven and exceptional medical and/or social needs.
 Rationale: This criterion is included to ensure parity across the other Trust schools.

Timescales

This consultation requires a six-week consultation period, as per the School Admission Code. The consultation period is from **13 November 2023 to 17 January 2024**.
