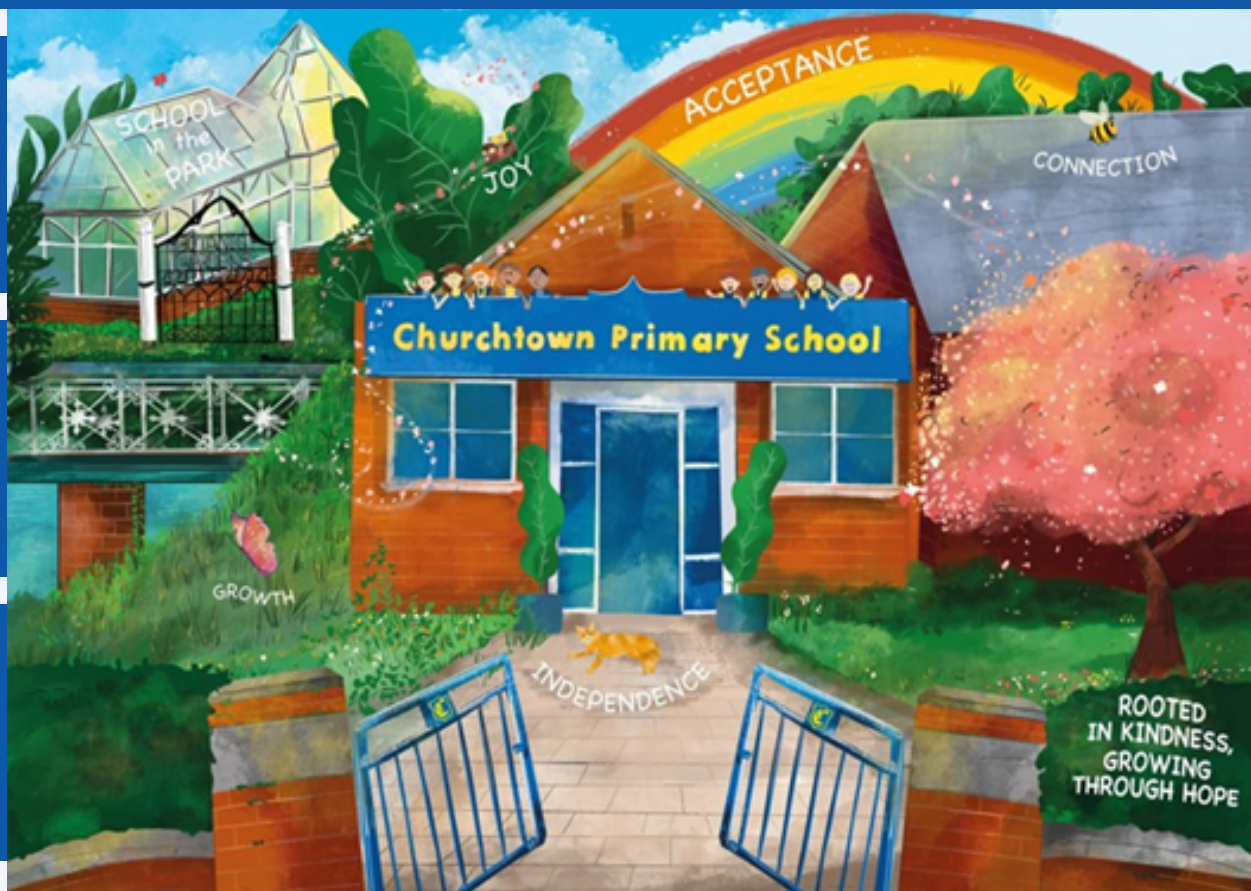

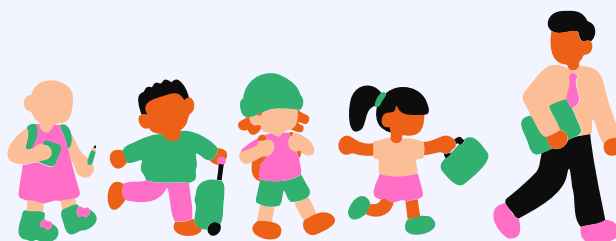
Local visit consent on Arbor

Big School Birdwatch



We would like to invite you and your child to take part in the Big Schools Bird Watch on Thursday 12th February 2026.

We will meet outside the front of the Botanic Garden's aviary at 3.40pm. The activity will last for approximately one hour. During this time, you and your child will be provided with a recording sheet and will observe and tally the number of each bird species visiting our local park. The results will then be submitted to the RSPB.

Every year, hundreds of thousands of people take part, helping to build a valuable picture of how garden birds are doing across the UK. This is a wonderful opportunity for children to engage with nature and contribute to an important national project.

As you will be attending with your child, you will be responsible for them throughout the activity. Please ensure that you bring any medication your child may need. A first aid kit will be available during the event. Toilets are also available in the park (20p).

We hope you are able to join us and support your child in this exciting learning experience.
