Dear Parent,

To be able to volunteer, you need to be a parent, (or someone who has parental responsibility) of a registered pupil at Churchtown Primary School. You do not need any specific qualifications. The enclosed sheet summarises the circumstances under which someone cannot serve as a Local Academy Councillor.

To fulfil the role, you will need to:

- attend regular meetings (around 3 each year)
- visit the school on a termly basis occasionally
- do some background reading
- take part in training, including induction training and mandatory training on Safeguarding,
 Cyber Security, PREVENT and GDPR and other development opportunities as provided by the Trust.

Every Local Academy Council needs a balance and diversity of knowledge, skills and experience. The Trust and school would welcome applications from parents with the following skill sets:

- strong links to the local community
- good data analytical skills
