### **Strike action by members of the National Education Union (NEU)**

I am writing to inform you about the proposed NEU strike action on **Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July 2023**.

#### **How will strike action affect Churchtown Primary School?**

When a strike takes place, those taking strike action stop work and withdraw their labour. This means that those teachers involved in the action will not teach their class(es) or undertake any other duties on a strike day.

It is therefore obligatory for me to consider the impact that industrial action will have on the operation of the school. One of the key issues is to assess whether there are sufficient staff available for the school to remain open, or partially open, during a strike.

To determine whether this school can remain fully or partially open, a detailed risk assessment has been conducted. This considers the impact that the action will have on the health and safety of our children, staff and visitors, and whether the school can run a full or amended curriculum, to determine whether it is possible to operate the school safely during the strike.

Every school in the country, not least in our Trust, is in a completely unique position because of the number of staff who are in the NEU or other professional associations. This means that the number of staff who have been called upon to take industrial action varies significantly between schools; every school will have to assess and manage their own particular circumstances.

#### **What does this mean for the 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> July 2023?**

Due to the number of staff that we anticipate will strike in school, there will be major disruption to our school provision over the two days. Our intention is to open the school in a limited capacity:

#### **On Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July 2023 and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July 2023:**

Our intention is to **open the school in a limited capacity to certain classes, to whom communication will be made separately by a school letter to make these classes and pupils aware**. We will also be offering an in-school provision for the specific needs of some of our pupils and we will contact their parents directly by phone on Friday the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023.

The children in school on these days may not be taught the curriculum and in some cases will be with staff who are different to who they are normally with. For those who are not in school, the expectations of weekly homework can be carried out at home, including reading, multiplication tables, board and card games, phonics, spellings, topic/theme research and any other weekly homework that has been set. 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### Free School Meals for Pupils

Pupils in receipt of free school meals will be provided with a packed lunch on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July. This can be collected from the main entrance of the school office from 9 am on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July and also again on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July. For those children who are not in school that day, a ParentApp message will be sent to those families that this applies to on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July 2023.

### Wrap around care and club provision

There will be wrap around care facilities taking place on **Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July** for those pupils **who are in school**.

Clearly this is a difficult situation, which will cause some disruption. I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A national strike by teachers is very unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the days that they are on strike.
