# Churchtown Primary School – Playground Relay

The Churchtown Playground relay began on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> April at Strike Lane Primary School and they travelled 11.7 miles to Brindle Gregson Lane who travelled 6 miles to Northbrook Primary Acadmey. On Wednesday, the baton continued its journey to Wellfield Academy (0.3 miles) and then onwards to Tarleton Academy (7.4 miles) and Burscough Priory Academy (9.7 miles) before finishing the day at Ormskirk School (3.7 miles). On Thursday the baton then travelled 8.6 miles to Linaker Primary School before finally arriving at Churchtown Primary School (2.7 miles), where a celebration event took place to welcome the baton prior to Mrs Payne and Sergio taking the baton to the London Marathon.
