
Easter Raffle

On Wednesday 27th March, a group of Year 3 and Year 4 children from Churchtown participated in the Fiestaval at Greenbank High School. This is a modern foreign languages festival celebrated yearly to raise awareness of foreign languages in the Primary setting, enthuse the pupils and give them a deserved opportunity to showcase what they have learned.

Ten other local Primary schools took part, showing and celebrating the students' skills in modern foreign languages like Spanish and French. It was a fabulous event which reminded us about the greatness of learning other languages and cultures.

Our Year 3 and Year 4 students performed a role play, followed by a fun Spanish inspired dance. The role play reflected a situation in which a group of people meet for the first time and they have something in


The time came to say *¡Adiós! Au Revoir!* to the Fiestaval for now, but we will see everyone again next year with more exciting performances.

Talk with your child about responsible use of their phone

Discuss what is okay and not okay to use their phone for. Talk about time limits and expectations of where the device can and cannot be used, this could include things like the phone being charged outside their bedroom overnight.



Discuss what to do if something upsetting or worrying happens

Give them the strategies they need in case something concerning happens whilst they are using their device. This could be to lock the screen and tell an adult, to make a report to the platform they are using, or to block the user.



Explore parental controls

Take a look at the controls available both on the phone itself and on your home Wi-Fi. Talk these through with your child too. Parental controls are a helpful tool, but an open conversation with your child is the most important thing.
