1. Practise the x2, x5, x10 times tables
2. Create a poster about addition and subtraction including examples
3. Pick a range of objects in your house and compare the mass and length.
4. Practise using number lines from 0-20 counting forwards and backwards.
5. Practise writing numbers to 20 correctly and recognising these numbers in different environments/

Global Learning

1. Research social justice and equity.
2. Create a video/poster/letter about the importance of this theme.



Writing

1. Practise writing tricky words and spelling words using the correct letter formation.
2. Write a narrative based on the plot of Red Reading Hood.

4. Create a fact file about a grandparent!
5. Research or visit a local care home and write a diary entry as an elderly person explaining the events of a typical day at the care home.
