## Science

1. What sources provide light and dark? Can you list as many as you can think of.
2. Search around your homes and local areas for reflective and non reflective materials?
3. Create a poster about the importance of sun protection.
4. Where can you find shadows? Draw a poster!

## PSHE

1. Encourage your child to reflect on their personalities.
2. Explore the similarities and differences in the personalities that each family member shares.

## Maths

1. Practice exploring with numbers up to 1000.
2. Go on a number hunt—where can you spot three-digit numbers?
3. Can you read the shopping receipt and try to order the numbers.
4. Count in your 50s and 100s—what patterns do you notice?
5. Practise using the column method to add and subtract two 3-digit numbers.

## Global Learning

Look at the News and spot any coverage about Human Rights. Discuss these with your children. Encourage them to justify their thoughts.



## Writing

1. Read a variety of texts, including books and newspapers. Identify features of these texts.
2. Write for different purposes at home, i.e. labels, shopping lists, and cards.
3. Practice writing paragraphs, using capitals letters, finger spaces and full stops.
4. Practice neat handwriting, correct letter formation and spelling words.

## The Arts

1. Practise mixing primary and secondary colours to make tertiary colours.
2. Practise painting using a range of brush strokes—can you find any other materials that give the brush effect?

## Humanities

1. Research and design a poster about slavery in America in the past—how does this link to human rights?
2. Use Google Earth or atlases/ maps to explore the United Kingdom and North America.
3. Can you create a fact file for UK and North America—think about the physical and human features, the types of farming and land.
