



Phonics

• Helps children develop good reading and writing skills.










Assessment


- Banded reading book will go home each Monday. Listen to your child read the story and talk about the story. Sign reading record book when read and return on a Thursday.

How else can you help with your child's learning?

- Talk, talk, talk!
- Read lots of stories (in addition to reading books)
- Teach letter formation in lower case
- Talk in your home language
- Play listening games, e.g. I spy, Sound Lotto
- 'What to expect, when...' document

- Suggestions for websites to visit at home
- Important notes / reminders

General Reminders
