What have we been learning this week?

Reception

In reception this week we have been learning about the four seasons through the story "The Story Orchestra – Four Seasons in one day". We have been learning about what happens in each season and have made a class poster about each of the seasons.

In Maths we have been learning to recognise and count numbers to 20. We have enjoyed playing number games such as Bingo using numbers 11 – 20 and a number track game where we took it in turns with our partner to roll a dice and move a counter along the track the corresponding number of times, with the winner being the first to reach the number 20. We also practiced counting Numicon pieces by drawing around them to make a Numicon City.

We made some fantastic vegetable characters and finger printed leaves onto tree branches.







Key Stage 1

Year 1

In Maths, Year 1 have been using arrays to support their learning of multiplication. They have also been recapping number bonds as this is a vital concept of learning that they will need when transitioning to Year 2 in September. In English they have been writing fact files about minibeasts. Their topic is minibeasts. This week Year 1 have been learning about what plants need to survive and they have planted some bee friendly flowers. We look forward to seeing these bloom in the summer! In Art this week Year 1 have created still life paintings using water colours.












Year 2 are continuing to read the book 'Wild' by Emily Hughes in their English lessons. They have been writing character descriptions and challenging themselves to use suffixes. In Maths, Year 2 have been using directional language such as clockwise, anticlockwise, quarter turn and half turn to describe the movement and turns of objects. They have found this quite difficult so it would be great to practice this over the weekend using MyMaths. Year 2's science learning has been about how animals or plants are suited to their habitat and how they depend on each other for the basic needs for survival. They have also been learning about the features of an Indian jungle in Topic which has offered an opportunity for the learning to be linked between Science and Topic.





Key Stage 2

Year 3 have continued our "Meet the Artists" topic this week by learning about Yayoi Kusama. Yayoi Kusama creates paintings using polka dots and we created our own pictures inspired by her work. In English, we have been re-writing the story of "Matisse's Magical Trail, focusing on our use of punctuation and writing to entertain the reader. In maths, we have been learning how to measure length in centimetres, metres and millimetres. We now know that there are 10mm in 1cm and 100cm in 1m. In PSHE, we have been focusing on friendships and how to solve conflicts successfully.









Year 4 have continued our Roman topic by learning about, the Queen of Iceni, Boudicca! The children have written diary entries in the first person using emotive language to describe how they would feel if they were Boudicca, and the Romans came to attack their land. Please see some examples below We have also published our writing from last week showing off our understanding of the process of Roman coins, some more examples below.

In Maths, we have learnt more about decimals and used our place value knowledge to help us round decimals to the nearest whole number. Another great week in Year 4 and we are looking forward to our **Roman Day next week (Wednesday 5th May)** where children and staff in Year 4 can dress up as Romans!



Year 5 - This week we have continued our Space topic and the children have been loving researching all about the Sun, Moon and Earth's orbits! We have learnt that the Moon and the Earth have identical rotation patterns and that we only ever see one side of the Moon! Next week in Science we are going to be creating our own Solar System orrerry!






In Maths we have continued our topic of Decimals. The children have learnt how to work out decimal sequences and worked really hard when adding and subtracting a decimal from a whole number!

During our PSHE this week we were focusing on friendships and how to resolve conflict. It was great to see such mature discussions around what makes a good friend and how to solve any conflict you may have. Well done Year 5!

English this week has been great fun! We have explored Curiosity – the Mars Rover – and learnt how it landed on Mars and how dangerous the mission was! We watched videos of the sheer relief NASA had when it finally landed safely and used all our great vocabulary from our text to write a newspaper report explaining how everyone felt.


