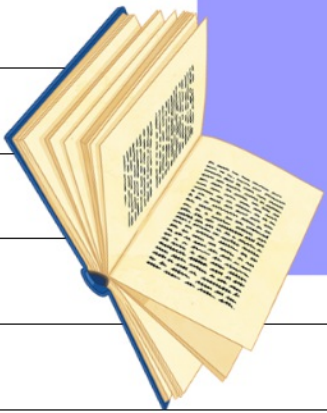
Haiku poems are a traditional Japanese art form.

Here's one...

My two plum trees are  
So gracious. See, they flower.  
One now, one later.

Here's another...

Winter is coming.  
Snow will be arriving soon.  
We should rake the leaves.



## What Did You Notice About the Poems?

Think about.

- the poem's theme;
- how many lines are in each poem?
- how many syllables in each line?

Natural theme.

Three lines in each poem.

5 syllables in first line,  
7 syllables in middle line,  
5 syllables in final line.



## How Can We Write a Haiku?

First, we need to choose a theme. It doesn't have to be about seasons or nature, but let's be traditional.

### Summer

Then, we brainstorm some words or phrases associated with that theme...

Can you think of any others?

hot	sunshine	flowers	holiday
beach	ice-cream	games	sea
swimming	fun	warm	sand



Next, we choose two or three ideas which will flow together.

Now we have our ideas, let's try to fit them into the 5-7-5 syllable format.

You might have to alter words or phrases slightly fit the pattern.

hot

sunshine

flowers

holiday

beach

ice-cream

games

sea

swimming

fun

warm

sand





Task: write a haiku, using a theme of your choice.

Each poem has only 3 lines.

The syllable pattern of the poem should be 5-7-5.

Haiku are often written about seasons and nature.

3 lines

5-7-5 syllable pattern
