Cross-curricular activities and ideas for the morning on World Book Day

Reading

PERFECT

answer questions about the story;

• retell the story in their own words;

• make connections with other stories they have read;

identify new words in the story and

discuss their meanings.

Technologies

- create a set of wings for an aeroplane;
- test their model to see how far it flies;
- give feedback to others about their wings.
- produce a book trailer using a PowerPoint presentation or images put into Movie Maker

Listening and Talking

- listen to the story Perfectly Norman;
- talk about how the children felt during the story;
- identify and discuss the key points and main characters of the story;
- discuss the thoughts and feelings of the main character in the story;
- answer questions about the story;
- talk about other stories with the same themes;
- talk about what they would do if they had wings;
- share qualities that make each person unique;
- retell the story in their own words;
- explore the vocabulary in the story and identify new words.

Drama

re-enact the story;

- act out what they would do if they had wings;
- engage in peer-feedback sessions about the reenactment of the story;
- act out different emotions and situations inspired by the story.

Dance

- create a dance with a partner imagining they had wings;
- move rhythmically to the music from Swan Lake;
- express a range of emotions through movement.

Art and Design

- create pictures with pops of colour;
- create a black and white picture with a colour portrait;
- draw a scene from the book
- design their own wings;
- create a feather for a collaborative wings class artwork;
- create a collage using different pieces of paper;
- discuss their feelings in response to portraits made by others;
- use a mirror to create a self portrait with wings;
- draw themselves with wings using Mr Milstead's template.

- measure the flight of a paper aeroplane;
- copy and complete patterns in work across the curriculum;
- identify different patterns and discuss them;
- use shapes to create pictures and illustrations;
