

I can answer exam style questions

What is an exam style question?

Sometimes when we read something, like in Guided Reading or Accelerated Reader, we need to answer some questions on the text that will prove we understand it.

There are different types of questions we might face:

You may recognise these from Guided reading?




An explain question is asking you to explain the answer and does not mean the answer is one word. For example: Explain why Bjorn wants to get into Valhalla?

because thats Viking heaven.



Bjorn wants to get inValhalla because the Vikings believe that Valhalla was their heaven and you can party and celebrate for all eternity. If Bjorn did not go to Valhalla he would go to Helhiem, which is the worst place for a Viking to go.





A vocab question may ask you to define something or find another word for something.

For example:

What does Valhalla mean?

heaven



Valhalla is a palace in which heroes killed in battle were believed to feast with Odin for eternity.



A retrieval question is asking you to retrieve the information from the text. For example:

On Page 39, how did we know that Erik and his men were scared to see the enchanter when they could not find the thief?

Erik was scared because he did not find the thief.



On page 39 it says "Erik and his men threw themselves on their knees before him..." This says to me that Erik wanted to show the Enchanter was sorry and needed mercy.



Prediction question is asking you think about what is coming next in the story.

For example:

What could happen next to Bjorn after he went into a Christain heaven?

He could try and escape.



Bjorn looked very angry and frustrated when he found out he was in a Christain heaven, with this I think that Bjorn could try and master his escape and go back to Valhalla.



Inference questions are asking you to guess the emotions, actions and thought process of the character. For example:

How is Bjorn feeling when he wakes up in Christain heaven?

Sad



I think Bjorn felt horrified and upset that he has worked so hard to die in battle and then right at the last minute it was taken away from him.



A summary question is asking you to conclude and evaluate the story: For example:
Order these events from The Saga of Bjorn.

We do these a lot in Guided reading and you should be really good at this now because of your sequencing episode.
