





# Firstly, we are going to plan our own Saga. Here is an example of mine:

Introduce Mission- To find a worth opponent to fight and die to get into Valhalla.

Begin mission – Isla will start to look for a worthy opponent. She will travel from Village to village fight the bravest of warriors.

Continue mission - As Isla travels she find many warrior but none of them are a match for Isla.

Fail mission - Isla is old and close to death, she is terrified she may not find her worthy opponent to send her to Valhalla.

Complete mission – Finally a young girl called Heltrix takes pity on Isla and challenges her to a fight. Isla decides to fight Heltrix and Heltrix wounds Isla very bad.




