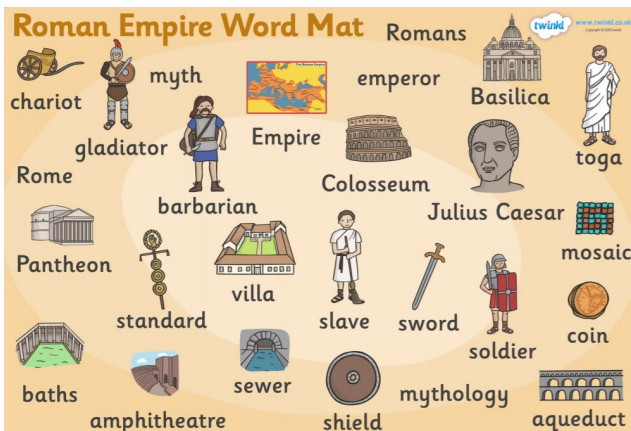


Rotten Romans Year 4 Summer 1

1	Invasion	One country attacking another to take it over
2	Legion	One unit of the Roman army had 4000 to 6000 soldiers in
3	Emperor	The leader of an empire. Similar to a king or queen
4	Amphitheatre	Where the Romans would go to be entertained
5	Mosaic	One picture made up of thousands of small tiles
6	Aqueduct	A system of pipes and channels used to bring water into the towns
7	Roman Numerals	The Roman system for counting based on seven different symbols IXLCDM
8	Toga	A loose flowing outer garment worn by the citizens of ancient Rome, made of a single piece of cloth and covering the whole body apart from the right



Key People and Places

1	Boudicca's Rebellion	AD60	The Romans decided that the Iceni tribe needed to start paying taxes but Boudicca, the ruler of the tribe, refused to let this happen and formed an army to fight the Romans. Thousands of people died in these battles but the Romans eventually won.
2	Hadrian's Wall	AD122	The Caledonian tribes fought battles against the Romans who had tried to take their land. The Romans wanted a way to separate their land from the Picts, so the Roman emperor, Hadrian, ordered a wall to be built to protect the Romans' land. The wall was 117km long with castles, guarded turrets, major forts, barracks, bathhouses and even hospitals.
