1. Retell the story of Abraham to an adult and explain why he is important to Jewish people.
2. Research Judaism and explore other special people that are important to Jewish people.
3. Create a poster about your faiths.

Science

1. Go for a local walk or explore your house in detail – what sounds can you hear? Are there any specific patterns or volumes?
2. Can you make an instrument using the materials you have at home?
3. Challenge yourself to creating a poster about sound and how it travels!

PSHE

1. Create a welcome poster for new members of your local community.
2. Write a persuasive advertisement about welcoming people to Civitas and how we all have the right to learn.
3. Discuss the meaning of being me!

Maths

1. Practice exploring with numbers up to 10,000.
2. Go on a number hunt— where can you spot roman numerals?
3. Can you read the shopping receipt and try to order the numbers.
4. Can you write your family birthdays in roman numerals and words?
5. Practise using the column method to add and subtract two 4-digit numbers.

Global Learning

1. Research the meaning of peace and conflict— what does it mean?
2. What things can we do to promote peace?



Writing

1. Read a variety of texts, including books and newspapers. Identify features of these texts.
2. Write for different purposes at home, i.e. narratives, shopping lists, diaries and newspaper reports.
3. Practice writing paragraphs using Year 4 writing features.
4. Practice neat handwriting, correct letter formation and spelling common exception words.

The Arts

1. Visit your local supermarket and identify the different types of bread.
2. Have a go at baking your own bread with the help of an adult.
3. Using the drawing techniques and sketch pencils, sketch a picture or object.

Humanities

1. Go for a walk around your local area— can you identify any human and physical features?
2. Use a map or atlas to find countries/cities using the four grid references.
3. Create a Roman vlog — dress up as a roman for the day
