### PE

We will continue to use our outdoor area everyday. Please provide a pair of named wellies, water bottle and waterproofs.

### Word of the week

We have a focus word of the week that we communicate through core boards, Makaton and verbally. Below are the words of the week for this term.

**need, are, is, some and all**

### Personal, social and emotional development

We are continuing to develop our life skills of being able to use the toilet, showing awareness of belongings and being able to tidy up our toys. We will continue to use the zones of regulation to communicate how we are feeling. We will have a focus on keeping play going by responding to our peers.

### Understanding the world

Our focus follows the word of the week curriculum. We are looking forward to exploring the world around us and practising the language we have learnt through our role play. We enjoy being outside and exploring the changing natural world around us with all our senses. We are going to be learning about caring for living things in the world around us.

### Expressive arts and design

Our focus follows the word of the week curriculum. We are looking forward to creating our own masks and using them to compliment our role play costumes.

### Physical development

We will be developing our gross motor and fine motor skills throughout the day.

Our fine motor skill focus will be developing our skills when using scissors. We will be developing our gross motor skills so we can move freely and with confidence in a range of ways e.g. skipping and hopping.

### Communication and language

We will focus on the word of the week and developing our use of core boards, Makaton and expressing our words verbally.

Each day, we also focus on the children's individual speech and language targets.

Through using zones of regulation, the children will explore communicating and expressing their feelings.

### Maths

In maths, we will be focusing on finding and representing numbers up to 10. We will be expanding on our prior knowledge of subitising and one-to-one correspondence. We will be also look at one more and one less in a variety of contexts.

We will be exploring 2D shapes and patterns in our environment.

### Literacy

In Drawing Club, we will be rotating through a story, a traditional tale and a cartoon as our stimulus on a tri-weekly cycle. The children will then use these to inspire their own drawing and writing. This term we will be looking at texts including The owl who was afraid of the dark and The magic porridge pot.

### Phonics

In our phonics lessons, we are learning Phase 3 sounds. By the end of Phase 3, the children will learn to read the following common exception words: me, be, we, he, she, was, you, they, all, are and my. We will continue to practice orally blending and segmenting to help us read and spell.
