## CURRICULUM INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

### Resource Base **Red Kites**



### Literacy

This term, pupils will continue to develop their literacy skills through the Talk for Writing approach, which encourages creativity while providing a clear structure for learning. Our English work will be inspired by the story *The Egg*, which will provide a stimulus for a range of engaging writing activities. Children will have opportunities to write simple sentences to express their thoughts, ideas and feelings, while learning to use appropriate punctuation to improve clarity and meaning. There will also be a focus on developing handwriting skills, with regular practice in letter formation through tracing activities and independent writing tasks. In addition, pupils will take part in daily guided reading sessions, where they will explore a variety of texts, develop their reading fluency, and deepen their understanding through discussion and comprehension.

### Mathematics

In Maths, pupils will continue to develop their understanding of addition and subtraction through practical activities, games and problem-solving tasks. They will practise combining and taking away numbers, using objects, pictures and number lines to support their learning. Children will build confidence in recalling number facts, solving simple calculations and explaining their mathematical thinking using appropriate vocabulary.

### P.E

In PE, pupils will take part in lessons led by Coach Dave, where they will develop a range of physical skills through fun and engaging activities. Children will practise fundamental movements such as running, jumping, throwing and catching, while also taking part in a variety of team games. These sessions will help to improve coordination, confidence, teamwork and communication skills, as well as encouraging an active and healthy lifestyle.

## Summer Term 2

# Red Kites

### Science

This term our Topic is 'Animals Including Humans'. The children will explore the different types of human teeth and their roles in helping us eat and digest food, while also learning about the importance of good dental hygiene, including regular tooth brushing. Pupils will investigate how living things depend on one another for food and will create simple food chains, using arrows to show the movement of energy from plants to animals.

### PSHE

In PSHE, pupils will take part in the "We Are Brilliant" unit, where they will explore what makes them unique and special. Through stories, discussions and practical activities, children will identify their strengths, celebrate their achievements and build confidence in themselves.

### History

In History, pupils will learn about monarchs and their role in the past and present. They will explore what kings and queens do, learn about some famous British monarchs, and compare life during different periods of history. Through stories, pictures and practical activities, children will develop an understanding of how monarchs have influenced the lives of people over time and how the monarchy has changed.

### RE

In RE, pupils will explore special places of worship and learn why they are important to people of different faiths. They will discover some of the features found in places of worship and discuss how these spaces are used for prayer, celebration and community gatherings.

### Art

In Art, pupils will continue to develop their painting skills through a range of creative activities. They will explore using different colours, brushes and techniques to create pictures inspired by a variety of themes.



### Music

Children will continue to participate in their daily singing sessions and will explore a range of educational songs which are based on our learning within other subjects.
