## CURRICULUM INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

### Year 5

### Spring Term 1 2026

#### TAKE ONE ARTIST

## ENGLISH

In writing, the children will be using a short film called 'The Ocean Maker'. They will be writing a narrative based on the story using relative clauses, consistent past tense and expanded noun phrases to describe character and setting. The children will then turn their attention to writing an explanation text about how the rain making machine works using adverbs for possibility, paragraphs and heading and sub-headings.

## SCIENCE

As scientists children will explore different forces including gravity and air/water resistance. The children will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of predictions and conclusions. They will also record their observations in a variety of ways.

## COMPUTING

Within Computing sessions, children will explore physical computing using the Crumble device. This will involve driving two motors with 4 input / output terminals. Additionally, children can connect LEDs, switches and other interesting add-ons.

## PSHE

The children will identify how they can make a positive contribution to the community and learn about the law and the consequences of not respecting it. They will also learn about the workings of local and national government and the role of charities and voluntary groups in British society.

## MATHS

Children will continue to develop their mathematical understanding of:

- ♦ Fractions, decimal and percentages.
- ♦ Statistics
- ♦ Area and perimeter

We thank you for your continued support in helping your child to memorise and apply their times tables through Times Table Rockstars.

## P.E.

PE will take place both indoors and outdoors. Children will continue swimming lessons as well as being taught tag rugby. P.E. kits must be brought in on a Monday and taken home on a Friday - appropriate for the time of year i.e. long trousers / joggers.

## HUMANITIES

Geography will focus on the understanding of how mountains, earthquakes and volcanoes work with a greater look at Japanese examples.

## Spring Term 1 2026 Year 5

### THEME:

'Take One Artist'  
The Shoreditch Sketcher

## MUSIC

Pupils will learn to sing the song Madina tun Nabi, develop their own accompaniment with a drone, chords, and improvisation, and play together with a percussion backing track. They will be developing their 'ear' with lots of echo singing and playing by ear. They'll find out about the type of song called a Nasheed and its connection with the Islamic faith.

## ART

This term we will be exploring the different media techniques of landscapes and cityscapes. The children will study the art work and techniques from 'The Shoreditch Sketcher' to inspire their own art pieces.

## MFL

The children will be continuing to learn French and will focus on learning vocabulary that is linked to food and drink. The children will learn how to order a range of different foods in different settings.

## RE

The children will be thinking about the question 'What spiritual pathways to moksha are written about in Hindu scriptures?

## HOMEWORK

The children will be given 1 piece of English and 1 piece of maths per week. This will normally be linked to the learning during that week.
