CURRICULUM INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Autumn Term 1, 2025
Year 4
Take One World



LITERACY

This term, the children's writing will be inspired by the video, Soar. We will write a mixture of genres including narrative and diary entries. As a continuation of previous terms, in Year 3 the children will investigate spelling patterns and apply them in their writing.

Reading and understanding texts, in particular the use of inference, will continue to be the focus this Autumn term.

SCIENCE

In Science, the children will be investigating 'Living things and their Habitats'. Children will be classifying animals according to their habitat and diet. In addition to this, children will be identifying different food chains and their webs, predators and prey.

COMPUTING

Our Computing topic is 'E Safety.' We will be learning about the world wide web and begin to understand more about networks and how data can be transferred through switches and routers from one network to another.

ART

In Art, we will investigate how to create visual narratives inspired by poetry and prose. We will focus on a story and use this to create various pictures.

MATHS

In Maths we will be focusing on our skills in:

- Number and place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Times tables—recall multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12

Using our mathematical problem solving skills will also be a focus during this half term.

MFL

In our 'Around Town' unit, we will learn to develop our intercultural understanding by being introduced to the sights of some typical French cities. They will also learn to describe places in a town, count to 100 and give their address in French.

GEOGRAPHY

Within Geography, the children will be learning to name and locate the continents of the world. We will learn to use a map key to identify OS symbols and find 4-digit grid references. We will also draw some sketch maps and scale drawings using aerial photographs.

RE

This term, we will be exploring Islam beliefs that Muhammad was a messenger of God . We will also describe ways that Muslims show their beliefs about Muhammad, such as in art.

MUSIC

This unit takes symmetry as the inspiration for exploring structure in music, and will be the basis for composing original music using similar concepts.

P.E.

During this term, the children will be learning Dance skills and developing their invasion and ball skills by playing Netball .

THEME:

'Take One World'

PSHE

This term, we will look at friendships, how friendships are formed and maintained, and the qualities of a good friend. We will then move on to focussing on disputes and bullying, and will address strategies for coping with each of these.
