ENGLISH

In reading, we are exploring "Black Powder" and working on improving and developing our reading and comprehension skills. In writing, we are focusing on setting descriptions and developing our vocabulary to describe. We will be consolidating our grammar skills throughout the term initialling focusing on word class and basic sentence punctuation.

MATHEMATICS

In Maths, the children will work on consolidating strategies for place value and the four operations of addition, subtraction, division and multiplication from Year 5- with a particular focus on written methods and reasoning. There will be a continuing focus on learning all times tables up to 12x12.

SCIENCE

This term, Year 6 will explore how the adaptation of plants and animals, to suit their environment, can lead to evolution. They will also look at how humans have changed over time and that a number of factors can affect a species' evolution.

GEOGRAPHY

The children will be using Ordinance Survey maps to develop their map reading skills. This will include using 6 digit grid references to locate different features and will find out why contour lines are useful. The children will create their own maps as part of this work.

MUSIC

We will be learning how to hold a part in a 3 part harmony whilst dancing in time with the music and each other. We will also explore singing with a sense of the context of the music.

ART

The topic for this term in art is producing 3D work from 2D work. The children will be looking at work by Lubaina Himid and using this to inspire their own creations.

HOMEWORK

English, Maths and Spelling homework will be sent out on a Friday to be returned on a Wednesday.

The children will continue to develop their conversational French and build upon their French vocabulary from Year 5. The theme will be 'Let's Visit a French Town'.

PSHE

The theme this term will be 'Very Important People' and will focus on relationships. Children will identify who their VIPs are within their families and friendship groups and how important kindness and respect are within these relationships. We will also explore conflicts and resolutions in relationships.
