If your child needs a reminder of their password to access these sites, please let your child's teacher know.

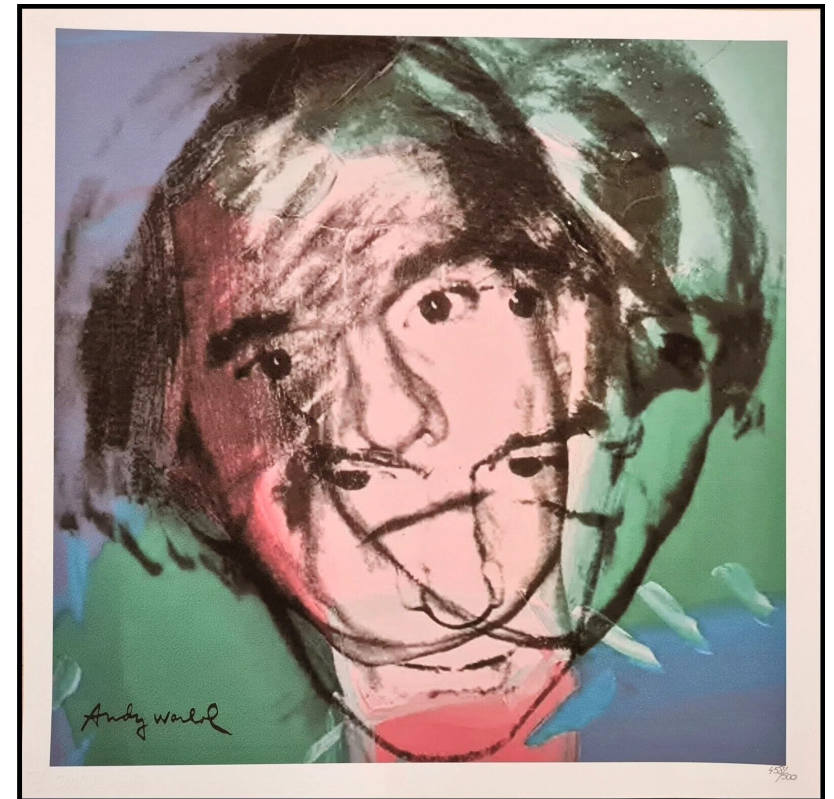

ENGLISH

This term will see the children begin to stretch their grammar and punctuation skills, mainly through the writing of narrative. They will be retelling the legend of Sweeney Todd from different perspectives using a range of punctuation and a widening vocabulary to engage the reader. In reading, the children will continue to build on their inference and vocabulary skills with a range of texts.

SCIENCE

Year 6 will be looking at the topic 'Changing Circuits'. We will be focussing on how adding or taking away components will change a circuit. The children will be doing lots of practical work and will also be learning the correct electrical symbols for the different components, when drawing circuit diagrams.

COMPUTING

This term, we will be exploring the programming of games and create a simulation of a score board. We will be modifying current coding and then using this to design and make our own games using coding.

ART

The theme for art in year 6 is 'Exploring Identity' whilst focusing on self portraits and will cumulate in creating a layered portrait.

MATHS

This term the children will revise the four operations. They will also extend their knowledge of fractions, decimals, percentages and start work on algebra. Throughout these topics, the children will continue to develop their reasoning skills through approaching problems in different ways.

MUSIC

Music will continue to develop their musical knowledge with tempo, pitch and rhythm.

Homework

There will be 1 piece of English homework, 1 piece of Maths and spelling homework. This will be given out on a Thursday and is due in on the following Tuesday.

As well as this, Year 6 children are expected to read at least 5 times a week and learn all their times tables and the related division facts.

P.E.

As part of the P.E curriculum we will be focusing on Dance and Tag Rugby. Both classes will have P.E lessons on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. **All children must have a change of shirt, shorts/ tracksuit bottoms and a spare pair of trainers.** Please make sure P.E is weather appropriate!

GEOGRAPHY

The children will be looking at the question. 'How do places vary in our world' They will explore different climates zones, the Arctic and Antarctic and will look at how the water cycle works.

PSHE

This term we will be exploring the topic of "One World". We will explore the importance of energy conservation, global warming and being mindful of how we treat our planet.

RE

In R.E, Year 6 will be looking at Hinduism. This will focus on how questions about how Brahman and Atman influence the way a Hindu lives.

Modern Foreign Languages

Children will continue to extend their spoken French and their understanding of France as a country.
