

## LITERACY

This term will develop the children's writing skills by utilising their grammar knowledge and using it to effect in their writing. The children will be designing their own magical creature and will be exploring the text type of non-chronological reports using this stimulus.

## SCIENCE

During this half term, Year 6 will be looking at how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals. They will be looking at the importance of the Linnaean System of Classification and who created it. The children will continue to practise their scientific predictions and

## COMPUTING

This term, we will be learning how to use and manipulate spreadsheets to calculate information.

## DT

We will be utilising our electrical knowledge from Science and our coding skills from Computing to design and create programmed circuits for an alarm system using Crumble.

## MATHS

This term the children will revise the four operations. They will also extend their knowledge of fractions, decimals, percentages and start work on algebra. Throughout these topics, the children will continue to develop their reasoning skills through approaching problems in different ways.

## MUSIC

Music will continue to develop their musical knowledge with tempo, pitch and rhythm.

## Homework

There will be 1 piece of English homework, 1 piece of Maths and spelling homework. This will be given out on a Friday and is due in on the following Wednesday.

**As well as this, Year 6 children are expected to read at least 5 times a week and learn all their times tables and the related division facts.**

## P.E.

P.E this term will be on Tuesdays and Wednesdays for both classes and will cover disco dancing and netball. Children will need to come to school on both days in FULL P.E kit. This must include a warm jumper and sensible shoes.

## GEOGRAPHY

The children will be looking at the question. 'How do places vary in our world' They will explore different climates zones, the Arctic and Antarctic and will look at how the water cycle works.

## PSHE

This term, the children will explore the topic of Digital Wellbeing. This will include: identifying the benefits and risks of the Internet; understanding the importance of looking after their digital wellbeing; recognising the signs of inappropriate and harmful online relationships; identifying the benefits and risks of social media; understanding that online bullying is wrong and what to do to get help to make it stop and explaining that not all online information is true.

## RE

In R.E, Year 6 are going to look at the Christian faith. In particular, the children will focus on resurrection and how Christians view life and death.

## Modern Foreign Languages

Children will continue to extend their spoken French from exploring different aspects of a town and asking directions.
