COVID-19 CATCH UP PREMIUM 2020/2021

Covid-19 Catch Up Premium Strategy Statement

The Covid-19 catch-premium was introduced to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds.

The overall aims of the school's catch-up premium strategy are:

- To reduce the attainment gap between your disadvantaged pupils and their peers
- To raise the attainment of all pupils to close the gap created by COVID-19 school closures

- The school's catch-up priorities are to address the additional barriers to learning resulting from COVID-19: curriculum, physical health and mental health.
- The core approaches focus on quality of teaching and teaching materials, targeted support and emotional wellbeing to help pupils catch up missed learning.

Catch-up funding is based on pupil numbers from the 2019.20 academic year at a rate of £80 per pupil.
