HEALTH AND SAFETY:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Good teaching standards applied• Good organisation/management of lessons by teacher and of subject by Subject Leader• Consistent safety standards applied across adults delivering PESS lessons• School policies, procedures and standards applied in all PESS lessons• Risk assessments reviewed regularly and accessible to all staff• Pupils involved in their own safety in line with age and ability• Appropriate size of court, pitch, hall and equipment for each age group carefully considered• Matching of pupils/teams in terms of comparable age, standard, ability and confidence in early stages of competition <p>2. USE OF PHYSICAL INTERVENTION</p>

STAFF:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Competence to teach activity to level of pupil ability checked and monitored • Observation and analysis skills effective to ensure safe practice • Control, discipline and organisational skills adequate • Positive, encouraging, educational manner, appropriate relationships and respect of pupils evident in all staff • DBS disclosure confirmed and acceptable by school where any adult works with group of pupils • Jewellery and personal effects removed/made safe • Professional development needs identified and supported with regular training • School procedures to deal with observation or disclosure of possible abuse known and applied consistently • Young sports leaders always supervised by adult staff • Staff avoid 1:1 situations with pupils wherever possible • Staff with designated First Aid responsibility known to all 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School policy on medication management followed • Staff trained in specific medical situations as necessary (e.g. epi-pens) • School-parent agreements on administration of medicines checked and applied to individuals <p>3. FIRST AID PROVISION:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provision for pupils available at all times on and off site • School has clear, detailed and effective procedures for managing first aid/emergency situations • Staff know and apply school procedures for management of first aid/emergency situations • Emergency contact system effective • Travelling first aid kit taken on all off-site visits • First aider with any group going off-site • Injury records made according to school procedures • School procedures followed for informing parents and follow up • Community users aware of limitations of first aid provision by school for lettings <p>4. DIGITAL IMAGERY AND ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School policy on staff contacting parents by phone, e-mail or text known and applied by all • Parents involved in any electronic communication about fixtures/visit arrangements – and only via “disclosed” list • Photography and filming used only within a clear learning context and parents made aware of such use within school policy • Clear procedures and agreement where imagery used across groups of schools <p>5. SCHOOL SECURITY:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All adults involved in PESS programme wear identification/are known to pupils • Facilities not in use locked wherever possible to prevent unauthorised access 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support – e.g. in dance or gymnastics – only given using appropriate techniques, with pupil informed and consent given <p>3. TRANSPORTING PUPILS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clear school policies on use of coaches for PESS activities • Seatbelts always worn in any vehicle • Emergency contact information carried by group leader • Safe embarkation/disembarkation points identified and used • Adult supervision ratios considered pre-journey • Accredited/well known coach companies used <p>4. INTIMATE CARE ISSUES WITHIN PESS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gender staffing implications considered where intimate care applied e.g. swimming • Dignity, decency and respect consistently evident • Intimate Care Policy followed by all members of staff <p>5. RESPONDING TO WEATHER CONDITIONS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Avoidance of over-exposure to sun effective • Rehydration systems in place • Staff teaching position avoids pupils looking directly into sun • Appropriate additional clothing allowed for cold conditions • Security of footing on playing surface considered

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High risk equipment disabled/locked to prevent unauthorised use • Equipment and facilities checked periodically for continued safe use.
