Matt Dickinson - Visiting Author

We were delighted to be joined by author Matt Dickinson on Wednesday 15 November. Matt spoke to our students about his adventures, explaining that for his tenth birthday he asked for a pair of mountain boots and since that point he has never looked back!

As an award-winning film maker and writer, he has lived a life of adventure, working extensively for National Geographic TV, Discovery Channel and the BBC. During his action-packed career, he has filmed on Everest's summit (the first British film maker to do so and get back alive), in Antarctica, Greenland, Alaska, the Sahara Desert and on top of the highest live volcano in the world.


'The Death Zone'-- his account of the ascent of Everest's North Face during one of the worst storms ever to hit the mountain has become a best seller in multiple territories around the world and is regarded as essential reading for all those who love mountain literature.

Matt has worked with some of the great characters from the world of adventure, including Bear Grylls and Brian Blessed. Along the way he has survived avalanche, a killer storm in the death zone and even a beaver attack in Alaska! In his popular events for schools he describes what motivates explorers to take risks in the extreme corners of the planet and brings alive the challenges faced by the people who live in the highest, coldest and most dangerous regions on earth. He visits about a hundred schools a year. Stunning pictures and video clips accompany his talks. He writes occasional travel articles for The Telegraph and The Guardian—mostly on the subject of Everest which he has returned to twice in recent years.

Recently Matt has been busy writing books to inspire a whole new generation of climbers and explorers. His teen/ya action series 'Mortal Chaos' was well received by young readers and critics alike and was followed by his Carnegie Medal nominated trilogy 'The Everest Files' and the multi award-winning thriller 'Lie Kill Walk Away.'

Recently his brand-new comedy series for primary age readers, 'Popcorn Eating Squirrels', has been launched to an enthusiastic response!

If you have a chance to see one of Matt's events you will be in for a breath-taking audio-visual tour of discovery to lands of ice and fire. Avalanches, killer icebergs and volcanoes guaranteed!





Andromeda

At the beginning of Year 12 the physics department sent out an offer for Sixth Form students interested in STEM. The balloon project tasks of a group of Sixth Form students to design a weather balloon payload capable of capturing images of the curvature of the earth. As a team we have nicknamed ourselves "The Cockermouth Andromeda Project", to mimic the naming structure of NASA, and go by this name on social media. We hope to launch the balloon in early winter this year (as long as there are agreeable weather conditions) and we believe it will carry our payload 130,000 ft up, into the upper atmosphere.

The images we capture will be used to show younger students what can be achieved by studying science subjects, and also as marketing material for companies who have sponsored us. In the group there are eight students, all with various roles, we are split into two teams: media and design. The design team consults with experts to create the payload and plan the launch, meanwhile the media team runs social media accounts and reaches out to companies to inquire about sponsorship. The project has had sponsorship and advice from various companies such as M-Sport and Createc, there is lots of work to come over the coming months, but the group is determined to have a successful weather balloon launch.



Rotary Young Musician

We are immensely proud of our connection with Cockermouth Rotary Club and are grateful to them for their continued support of our school. The Young Musician competition is one that is always looked forward to by staff, students and families alike.

This year saw students partake in voice, piano and guitar pieces in front of judges: Richard Bennett, Karen Shankland, Phil Wood, Wendy Saunders and Jean Lack, and an audience from our local community. The judges were very complimentary and stated that the students had chosen interesting and ambitious pieces.



The overall winner was Jason M (Year 11) who played two piano pieces. Runner up was Jackson J (Year 10) who sang and accompanied himself on the guitar, his song choices of Wagon Wheel and Brown Eyed Girl were sung with conviction and were most enjoyable to listen to.

Congratulations to all who took part, and our thanks again to Cockermouth Rotary Club.


The Sound of Music

Members of the club have taken produce home to share with their friends and families, and any leftover have been sold to staff to raise money for more seeds and compost. The club are hoping to increase crop diversity next year as well as experiment with permaculture methods such as companion planting and building a Hügelkultur bed.


Summer 2023 Exam Outcomes

We are delighted that this year's summer GCSE results show that we remain the highest performing school in Cumberland. Our Progress 8 score (+0.42) also places significantly above average on a national level.

What we are particularly proud of in these results is that all groups of students, whether they have high, middle or lower prior attainment and those with SEND have made great progress in their five years at Cockermouth School. This is what we really value, as an inclusive and comprehensive school that aims to provide an exceptional learning experience for all those in our school community.

This published data shows the progress that each student has made across eight GCSE subjects from the scores they achieved in their SATS. The chart below shows an illustration of the progress students in our school make when compared to the National and Cumberland average Progress 8 scores.


5 Year journey



Following on from our excellent GCSE results, our average points score for A Level courses in 2023 places our Sixth Form in the top 20% of schools nationally, and the % of students achieving a minimum of AAB grades at A Level places us in the top 10%.

Once again, and most importantly, is how these results enabled our Year 13 students to progress into the next phase of their education, training or employment. The chart to the right shows the breakdown of destinations for students leaving our Sixth Form in 2023.

We are incredibly proud of the achievements of our students, that is a product of the hard work and commitment of our students, the high levels of academic and pastoral support that students in our school receive every day and, of course, the support that is received from parents and carers.
