

For school aged children in Reception to Year 6. This Winter Club will provide life skills and help build confidence, with fun activities and multi-sports. Children will be able to access a nutritious meal, as well as refreshments which will be provided by Fit Kids Zone CIC. Children must receive benefit related free school meals (FSM) and have a HAF code. If you receive this benefit, your child will be

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
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PUNCTUALITY

Please let's start the New Year with better attendance and time-keeping.

It is important that pupils are punctual so that they do not miss out on the beginning of each school day. Children must attend on time to be given a present mark for the session. If a pupil arrives late to school every-day, their learning begins to suffer. Below is a graph showing how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.



(Over one academic year)

Any child who arrives for school after 8.50am will be marked as late.

Any child who arrives for school after 9.20am will be given a U code. This is an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's overall attendance figure. These unauthorised absences might be referred to the Local Authority and a penalty notice may be considered.

Medical and Dental Appointments:

- Where possible such appointments should be booked outside of school hours
- <u>Pupils are expected to attend school prior to the appointment and return to school after the</u> <u>appointment</u>. Any absence outside of the appointment/travel time will be unauthorised.

CONCERNS – SAFETY OF PARKING/ENTRANCE ACCESS – WE NEED YOU TO:

Again, we have had complains and concerns from local residents about driving at speed, not stopping at junctions and parking. In particular, Beech Avenue, Hatchford Walk, Alder Drive, Lime Grove. We need you to:

- <u>Reduce your speed</u> in and around the school site. The speed limit is 5mph on school property. Be observant when reversing and when driving through the walkway at each entrance.
- Park legally, and with consideration to residents and others, leaving access to the school, resident's driveways and public pathways free. The blocking of pavements means parents with pushchairs having to walk in the road, an accident waiting to happen. It's also a hazard for emergency services.
- Keep music and noise down as some residents work shifts so may be trying to sleep.
- Do not park under the barrier or on the curved part of the front entrance, delivery vehicles need to have access and this causes a safety hazard. If you park in this way and your vehicle is damaged the school is <u>not</u> responsible.
- Ideally, park away from the school site and walk in, this will ease congestion. Please take litter home or put in the bins provided.

We all have a responsibility and nothing comes before the safety and well-being of the children and school community. Please help us to be a safe and happy community, give a bit of thought and show respect and kindness to others. Thank you for your support in this matter.



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INFORMATION REGARDING ADMISSIONS FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

All applications for school places for September 2025 have to be made via the Council website: <u>http://www.solihull.gov.uk/admissions</u>. If you live outside Solihull you must apply to your local council even if you want to include Solihull schools on your application.

Information for Year 6 Parents – applying for a Secondary School place for September 2025

Children with a date of birth between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014 (current Year 6) transfer to secondary school in September 2025. The closing date for applying online was 31st October 2024. **Offer day is** 1st **March 2025.**

Information for Nursery Parents – applying for a Reception place for September 2025

Children with a date of birth between 1st September 2020 and 31st August 2021 start full-time school in September 2025. This first year is called 'Reception'. Please ensure that you apply online for a school place through the Local Authority/council website you live in before the **closing date 15th January 2025**. Offer day is 16th April 2025. https://www.solihull.gov.uk/Schools-and-learning/School-admissions

Applying for a Nursery school place

We currently have spaces available in our Nursery for children who have turned 3-years-old. Children can start with us the term after they turn 3 years old and they are entitled to 15 hours of Nursery education (AM or PM daily sessions). You can also apply online for 30 hours of free Nursery education via the Government website at https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare (certain criteria apply).

Please note that all admissions are now completed online (with the exception of Nursery). If you do not have access to a computer you can visit any library and use the computers there. To ensure your space, please do not miss the deadlines specified and please ensure that you complete the appropriate admissions forms.

2 Year and 3-4 Year Provisions

Nursery 2-Year-Old Provision

Children who are 2 years old may be entitled to a free nursery place for up to 15 hours per week. Please use the following link to check if you are eligible:

Nursery 3- and 4-Year Olds

All children aged 3 to 4 years are entitled to 15 hours of early education funding per week the term after their 3rd birthday.

Extended childcare is also available between the hours of 8.00am-5.15pm for nursery children at an additional cost. *For more information or to apply for a place please email 15admissions@chs.solihull.sch.uk*

Improving Communication Links with School

To keep your child/ren safe and ensure their well-being, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our links with you and keep everyone up-to-date and well informed. As sending written information home is sometimes unreliable; we are continuing to use Schoolcomms, an electronic school communication system. This will enable you to receive all your information from school quickly and reliably. We can send letters by email to your inbox and short messages directly to your mobile phone as a text message, or if you have an Apple or Android mobile phone, by app message. In addition to Schoolcomms, we also use ParentPay for trips, dinner money etc and Class Dojo for communicating with parents.

URGENT: <u>Keep the office informed of your current mobile number and email address</u>. If you are not receiving <u>communication by these sources please contact the school office and they will look into the reason why</u>. Help us to help you, thank you. School Meals

Reception, Years 1 and 2 are entitled to a free school meal regardless of a parent's income. Year 3 upwards, as you are aware, are now required to pay for your child's school dinners as they will no longer qualify for the Government's Universal Infant Free School meals programme. Some families may be entitled to continue claiming free school meals depending on family income - if you would like to apply for free school meals, please do so via the Solihull council website at: http://www.solihull.gov.uk/fsm. Families that do not qualify will be charged for each school meal their child has; payment is to be made online via ParentPay or at any PayPoint. A school dinner for one child will cost: £2.90 per day / £14.50 per 5-day week.

Dinners/Trip Payments



Please could we remind you that dinners should be paid for in advance. Any outstanding debts should be paid as soon as possible. Any debts move through the school with the child, thank you. Please discuss if you are in need. School dinners are £2.90 a day.
