I would also like to thank you as parents for your support and wish you all a very Happy Easter.



#### **INFORMATION REGARDING ADMISSIONS FOR SEPTEMBER 2024**

All applications for school places for September 2024 have to be made via the Council website: <a href="http://www.solihull.gov.uk/admissions">http://www.solihull.gov.uk/admissions</a>. If you live outside Solihull you must apply to your local council even if you want to include Solihull schools on your application.

## Information for Year 6 Parents – applying for a Secondary School place for September 2024

Children with a date of birth between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2012 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2013 (current Year 6) transfer to secondary school in September 2024. **Offer day was 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024.** 

## Information for Nursery Parents – applying for a Reception place for September 2024

Children with a date of birth between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020 start full-time school in September 2024. This first year is called 'Reception'. **Offer day is 16<sup>th</sup> April 2024.** 

#### Applying for a Nursery school place

We currently have spaces available in our Nursery for children who have turned 3-years-old. Children can start with us the term after they turn 3 years old and they are entitled to 15 hours of Nursery education (AM or PM daily sessions). You can also apply online for 30 hours of free Nursery education via the Government website at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare">https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare</a> (certain criteria apply).

### CHS offers Nursery Provision for Children aged 2 to 3 and 3 to 4 Years

#### **Nursery 2-Year-Old Provision**

Children who are 2 years old before 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024 may be entitled to a free nursery place for up to 15 hours per week. Please use the following link to check if you are eligible.

#### \*\*Introduction of New Childcare Funding Scheme for Working Families\*\*

The new scheme starting in April 2024 is able to offer childcare for 2-year olds where their family meet criteria relating to being in employment. The new scheme is managed by the National Childcare Service.

To apply for this new childcare funding for working families please apply to the National Childcare Service by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024 for your code for the Summer 2024 term. Parents can also call them on 0300 123 4097 if you need support submitting your application.

#### Nursery 3- and 4- Year Olds

All children aged 3 to 4 are entitled to 15 hours of early education funding per week the term after their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday. If your child is 3 years old before 31<sup>st</sup> March you can apply for a place to start in April 2024.

Extended childcare is also available between the hours of 8.00am-5.15pm for nursery children at an additional cost. For more information or to apply for a place please email 15admissions@chs.solihull.sch.uk



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## **NSPCC Number Day**



We celebrated 'NSPCC Number Day' on Friday  $2^{nd}$  February 2024 with a focus on 'Measurement'. Children brought in different fruits and vegetables from home. Across the school, we completed various practical activities.

**Nursery and Reception**: Children compared the different lengths of the fruits and vegetables using the words 'long' and short'.

- **Year 1:** Children explored the different lengths of carrots using non-standard units. They compared the length of the carrots using vocabulary such as 'longest' and 'shortest'.
- Year 2: Children measured the length of their carrot using a ruler and sorted the carrots from smallest to largest.
- Year 3: Children measured the length of their carrot using cm and mm. They compared the lengths of the carrots.
- **Year 4:** Children created a bar graph on the types of fruits and vegetables that were brought in from home. The bar graphs shown which fruit and vegetable were the most popular.
- Year 5: Children weighed their potatoes and converted the units from grams to kilograms.
- Year 6: Children weighed their potatoes using scales. They worked out the mean weight of the potatoes.

On Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2024 our choir joined Young Voices at Resorts World to perform alongside other children and schools. We are very proud of everyone.

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




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## World Book Day – 7<sup>th</sup> March 2024

### Improving Communication Links with School

To keep your child/ren safe and ensure their well-being, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our links with you and keep everyone up-to-date and well informed. As sending written information home is sometimes unreliable; we are continuing to use Schoolcomms, an electronic school communication system. This will enable you to receive all your information from school quickly and reliably. We can send letters by email to your inbox and short messages directly to your mobile phone as a text message, or if you have an Apple or Android mobile phone, by app message. In addition to Schoolcomms, we also use ParentPay for trips, dinner money etc and Class Dojo for communicating with parents.

**URGENT:** Keep the office informed of your current mobile number and email address. If you are not receiving communication by these sources, please contact the school office and they will look into the reason why. Help us to help you, thank you. Limited information can also be found on our website and noticeboards around school.

#### Update Information via SIMs ParentLite App

Parents may update some of the information we hold on their child electronically, via the SIMS ParentLite App, such as: emergency contacts, cultural information, dietary requirements, medical information, parental consents (for things such as photos, etc.), and student details. You should have received an invitation email to access the system - if you have parental responsibility. Parents will not be able to see other emergency contact's information if they do not live at the same address as the child. If you have not received an invitation email, please contact the school office.

There is no smoking or vaping allowed on the school site or just outside the gates. Thank you for your co-operation.



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

- In the line at 10 to 9! If your child is arriving after 8.55am, they are late for school, and will need to report to the school office! (For Nursery and Early Years start and finish times, please consult your class teacher).
- ➤ If your child is **absent from school** it is up to you as parents/carers to inform the school office on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of absence before 9.15am **(0121 779 8070 or email office@chs.solihull.sch.uk)**. It is **your** responsibility to provide a reason for your child's absence. If not provided it will be marked as **unauthorised**.
- Medical appointments Pupils are expected to attend school prior to the appointment and return to school after the appointment. Evidence should be shown. Any absence outside of the appointment/travel time will be unauthorised.
- Where possible medical appointments should be booked outside of school hours.



Next term, we are launching a 'Going for Gold' attendance mission. During the Summer term, we are aiming for our attendance to reach at least 95% or above for the whole school. Should we achieve this, there will be a whole school prize to coincide with our Attendance Reward Day on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> July.
