NOTE FROM THE HEADTEACHER AND LEAD LEARNER

Dear Parents and Carers,

After a very long and busy term, we are almost ready for the Christmas break and to spend time with family, friends and loved ones. We hope you have enjoyed the Christmas performances as the children and staff put a great deal of effort into the preparation – as always, we can count on the children at CHS to spread the Christmas cheer! This week, each class has engaged in 'Winter Wonderland' activities and created some beautiful cards and calendars.

Over the last few months, we have been proud to witness the development of our pupils in so many different ways and the level of engagement in wider activities and community events continues to increase term on term. Please do encourage your child to attend the different activities available open to them in order for them to access all of the opportunities school life has to offer.

As many of you know, I have been working across the Local Authority supporting school improvement work and seeing first-hand the brilliant work that takes place in Solihull Schools. This will continue in Spring and Summer 2024 and in my absence [3 days per week], Miss Budd is the Acting-Headteacher and Mr Russell the Acting Deputy-Headteacher. However, I still hold full responsibility so if there are any concerns that do not get resolved, please do request a meeting via the school office. We continue to work alongside Langley Secondary school and some other primary school partners regarding the creation of a new Multi-Academy Trust and will be formally consulting with parents and staff in the Spring term.

Last but not least, please see the section on punctuality [page 2] as we begin to revise our systems around this. At the moment, we are having a significant number of children arriving late and the children find this very difficult. We will be working with individual families in more detail to understand the barriers because the expectation is that we arrive in school on time. We will also be conducting a review of our behaviour and relational policies to ensure all children feel safe in school and we promote a calm and orderly atmosphere.

Fit Kids Zone Solihull HAFs Winter Camp: Tuesday 2nd **– Thursday 4**th **January** 9am-3pm at Coleshill Heath School for school aged children in Reception to Year 6.

The Solihull HAF aims to provide life skills and help build confidence, with fun and creative activities and multi-sports. Children will be able to access a nutritious meal, if in receipt of benefit-related free school meals (FSM) and have a HAF code. If you receive this benefit, your child will be eligible to attend HAF sessions for free and will have received a letter confirming eligibility. 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


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PUNCTUALITY

Please let's start the New Year with better attendance and time-keeping.

It is important that pupils are punctual so that they do not miss out on the beginning of each school day. Children must attend on time to be given a present mark for the session. If a pupil arrives late to school every-day, their learning begins to suffer. Below is a graph showing how being late to school every day over a school year adds up to lost learning time.



Our allocated CSAWS Attendance & Welfare Officer, Mrs Redpath will be conducting occasional late gates to speak to all parents who bring in pupils late (after 9.00am)

Medical and Dental Appointments:

- Where possible such appointments should be booked outside of school hours
- Pupils are expected to attend school prior to the appointment and return to school after the appointment.

 Any absence outside of the appointment/travel time will be unauthorised.

CONCERNS – SAFETY OF PARKING/ENTRANCE ACCESS – WE NEED YOU TO:

Again, we have had complains and concerns from local residents about driving at speed, not stopping at junctions and parking. In particular, Beech Avenue, Hatchford Walk, Alder Drive, Lime Grove. We need you to:

- Reduce your speed in and around the school site. The speed limit is 5mph on school property. Be observant when reversing and when driving through the walkway at each entrance.
- Park legally, and with consideration to residents and others, leaving access to the school, <u>resident's</u> driveways and public pathways free. The blocking of pavements means parents with pushchairs having to walk in the road, an accident waiting to happen. It's also a hazard for emergency services.
- **Keep music and noise down** as some residents work shifts so may be trying to sleep.
- > Do not park under the barrier or on the curved part of the front entrance, delivery vehicles need to have access and this causes a safety hazard. If you park in this way and your vehicle is damaged the school is <u>not</u> responsible.
- ➤ Ideally, park away from the school site and walk in, this will ease congestion.

We all have a responsibility and nothing comes before the safety and well-being of the children and school community. Please help us to be a safe and happy community, give a bit of thought and show respect and kindness to others, but more importantly think of the lives and safety of young innocent children.

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INFORMATION REGARDING ADMISSIONS FOR SEPTEMBER 2024

All applications for school places for September 2024 have to be made via the Council website: http://www.solihull.gov.uk/admissions. If you live outside Solihull you must apply to your local council even if you want to include Solihull schools on your application.

Information for Year 6 Parents – applying for a Secondary School place for September 2024

Children with a date of birth between 1st September 2012 and 31st August 2013 (current Year 6) transfer to secondary school in September 2024. **Offer day is 1st March 2023.**

Information for Nursery Parents – applying for a Reception place for September 2024

Children with a date of birth between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020 start full-time school in September 2024. This first year is called 'Reception'. Please ensure that you apply online before the closing date which is **15**th **January 2024** via the Local Authority that you pay your council tax to, if this is not SMBC. **Offer day is 16**th **April 2024.**

Applying for a Nursery school place

We currently have spaces available in our Nursery for children who have turned 3-years-old. Children can start with us the term after they turn 3 years old and they are entitled to 15 hours of Nursery education (AM or PM daily sessions). You can also apply online for 30 hours of free Nursery education via the Government website at https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare (certain criteria apply).

Please note that all admissions are now completed online (with the exception of Nursery). If you do not have access to a computer you can visit any library and use the computers there. To ensure your space, please do not miss the deadlines specified and please ensure that you complete the appropriate admissions forms.

CHS offers Nursery Provision for Children aged 2-4 Years

Nursery 2-Year-Old Provision

Children who are 2 years old may be entitled to a free nursery place for up to 15 hours per week. Please use the following link to check if you are eligible:

Nursery 3- and 4-Year Olds

All children aged 3 to 4 years are entitled to 15 hours of early education funding per week the term after their 3rd birthday.

On Friday 8th December we held Christmas Jumper Day and raised £137 for "Save the Children". Thank you for your support.







School Meals

Reception, Years 1 and 2 are entitled to a free school meal regardless of a parent's income. Year 3 upwards, as you are aware, are now required to pay for your child's school dinners as they will no longer qualify for the Government's Universal Infant Free School meals programme. Some families may be entitled to continue claiming free school meals depending on family income - if you would like to apply for free school meals, please do so via the Solihull council website at: http://www.solihull.gov.uk/fsm. Families that do not qualify will be charged for each school meal their child has; payment is to be made online via ParentPay or at any PayPoint. any PayPoint. A school dinner for one child will cost: £2.70 per day / £13.50 per 5-day week.





Please could we remind you that dinners should be paid for in advance. Any outstanding debts should be paid as soon as possible. Any debts move through the school with the child, thank you. Please discuss if you are in need. School dinners are £2.70 a day.

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
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SMBC will be installing a zebra crossing on Moorend Avenue, near to Willow Way in the Spring.

Improving Communication Links with School

To keep your child/ren safe and ensure their well-being, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our links with you and keep everyone up-to-date and well informed. As sending written information home is sometimes unreliable; we are continuing to use Schoolcomms, an electronic school communication system. This will enable you to receive all your information from school quickly and reliably. We can send letters by email to your inbox and short messages directly to your mobile phone as a text message, or if you have an Apple or Android mobile phone, by app message. In addition to Schoolcomms, we also use ParentPay for trips, dinner money etc and Class Dojo for communicating with parents.
