Unity Rescues Baby Clinic



School Buildings Corner - Kingshurst School was

extended providing two extra classrooms and an ancillary space, This enables the school to take an additional form of entry on alternate years. Recently we saw the re-modelling of Windy Arbor School including an additional Resource Centre to cater for pupils with Autism. It is part of an evolving borough wide initiative to create special locations within mainstream schools the ability to support pupils with these particular needs.

The Kingshurst baby clinic had to close earlier this year due to the redevelopment of the town centre and there was no option of alternative premises. As a result mums in Kingshurst would no longer have access to a clinic where they could see health visitors for advice and check on their baby's progress. Unity came to the rescue and offered the newly appointed Community Hub at Capitol House, Yorkswood School Campus, Kingshurst Way, as their new home. This is now running successfully for the community each Monday afternoon and Tuesday morning. It is the intention that mums will have an opportunity to access other services of support from the hub too.

Working Together to Help Local People

Unity have joined forces to help local people into work. Funded by the European Social Fund and led by Solihull Council, Unity are working in collaboration with Solo and Colebridge Trust to help people into work or training. In particular, additional support is being provided for those over the aged of 50; lone parents; carers; those with disabilities or anyone with mental health issues. Intervention support workers are helping with general employability skills as well as issues to do with health and wellbeing. Most of the team are local residents themselves, who have a good understanding of the local barriers to employment. There are opportunities for work experience, short courses and employment opportunities. As a result of this programme five people are now in work having been long term unemployed. Improving Job Prospects

The main purpose of the hubs is to help improve economic well being within North Solihull. New projects are being introduced to help support this and Unity are working in partnership with Solihull Council and other agencies to achieve the objective. Unity has been building links with the Co Op which has a store in Craig Croft opposite the Bishop Wilson Hub and School. They are hoping to offer parents the chance to improve their job prospects by offering workshops at the Hub and then work experience in their store.

Elmwood Place Community Hub

The Elmwood Community Hub is situated within the council building at Burton's Way, Smith's Wood. It offers public access to computers and a small library area in reception. It is on the first floor where the Hub can be found consisting of an IT suite and a large meeting space. Various activities are on offer to the community here including art and craft groups, IT classes, Job Shop, Keep Fit for the elderly and parent support for those with teenagers. We are hoping to

support Barnardo's who want to deliver their study programme for ages 16-19 year olds who are not at college or work.
