Putting your mind at Ease

1. Parking

All contractors and employees will be provided with a parking space on the site and NO PARKING signs will be placed around the local area to prevent any contractors parking outside your home.

2. Noise

We have changed our site working hours from 7am to 5pm to 8am to 6pm to minimise early morning noises from site vehicles and activities. We will monitor noise levels regularly to ensure we don't exceed permitted noise allowances.

3. Security

All Morgan Sindall sites are monitored 24 hours a day 7 days a week with full CCTV camera and security provisions.

4. Deliveries

All deliveries will be via Beech Avenue, where they will be greeted by a full time gateman who will ensure all deliveries are taken onto site immediately to prevent any congestion or parking issues and no deliveries will be organised before 8am.

The new school is part of the North Solihull Partnership's regeneration programme which has seen £60 million of Council funds invested in replacing or refurbishing all the primary schools in the North of the borough, alongside new developments in the village centres in Chelmund's Cross and Smith's Wood.
