Equipment: As two-thirds of the available marks are on calculator papers, it is essential that your child has a calculator to use on a daily basis so that they can learn how to use it effectively. At school we use the Casio fx-83 GT, potential A level Mathematics students may wish to purchase the Casio fx-991ex Classwiz in preparation for their studies; these may also be used in GCSE Examinations

Although not used as often, a compass and protractor are also essential for some topics.


Revision: vle.MathsWatch.com: This website is perfect for revision. A focussed revision task is set before every assessment (around every 6 weeks) to help students structure their revision into manageable chunks. Your child often works through revision questions that are set for them by their teacher in computer room lessons, but this is not the only way it can be used. Students can log in and revise topics that they have selected by themselves, by watching the video tutorials and answering the interactive questions.

Written examination: 1 hour. 25% of the qualification



Component 3: Study of Islam.
