Fairer Funding Update

Most of you are aware of the Government's planned funding changes that threaten to affect us if they go ahead. Many schools across the country stand to lose but Cheshire East will receive the least amount of funding of all.

Thank you to everyone who's supported our efforts to halt these changes, those of you who completed the online response survey at home or at one of our in-school sessions, signed petitions, joined marches, written to MPs and so on.

The Consultation Period for the Government's proposed new Funding Formula has now closed but you can still sign the Fair Funding for all Schools' petition. Fiona Bruce MP, the MP for Congleton, is already working with us to fight for a fairer deal but if you are within another MP's constituency, then email or send a letter to them to raise your concerns.

Staffordshire University Film Production team visited the school this term to discuss the range of courses on offer and the sorts of careers they can lead to .



Bringing Science to Life



Like young people all over the world, many of our students are uncertain of what the future holds, which direction to take and where they see themselves in years to come. As a result, choosing GCSE Options can become something of a 'lucky dip,' with no real reason for the subjects chosen. At Congleton High, we aim to guide and support our students

It was also another good way of showing students the many different careers that are accessible via the study of STEM subjects.








Sun, Snow and Superb Skiing


Investing in the Future
