I would welcome your views on our termly newsletter and if you have any ideas or contributions for future editions please contact me on principal@congletonhigh.com.


May I take this opportunity to wish you all a very happy Christmas as we end yet another successful term.



David exhibited findings from his investigation 'Does Inflammatory Arthritis exist?' at the Celebration evening and was congratulated by judges on the very high level of his work.

The Nuffield Foundation provides the Science Bursary Awards to enable the highest achieving students to work alongside professional scientists, technologists, engineers and mathematicians. David is one of several Congleton High School students who have received Nuffield Bursary Awards over the past few years.

Programme'.




Our Chair of Governors, Richard

On being awarded this prestigious title, Richard Hinckley said "Every child deserves a good education and I hope I can play my part in bring this about."





Thank you to the 236 parents who completed our annual online survey. We are very pleased that the vast majority of parents and carers agree with the 13 statements.
