KS2 visit to Houses of Parliament

On Monday, we were lucky enough to go to London to see the Palace of Westminister, AKA the Houses of Parliament. Did you know it used to be the royal house and the last King of England to live there was Henry VIII? We learnt that today, a bill (a baby law) gets bounced from the House of Commons to the House of Lords like a game of Parliamentary ping-pong that can last up to one year, before it is agreed and presented to the King to be made into a new law.

After our fascinating tour of the House, we took a cruise along the River Thames. We saw the tallest building in Europe (the Shard) and Shakespeare's Globe Theatre. Did you know that soon after it was built in 1613, they used a canon to make the sound of thunder? It was a mistake because the theatre caught fire and burned to the ground; it had to be rebuilt the following year!

Along the Thames we also saw the Tower of London where royal prisoners were kept. Two of Henry VIII's wives were executed there. (Anne Boleyn and Catherine Howard). We also saw the London Eye where many people propose—there have also been 20 rejections of marriage!

Did you know that in the Victorian era, the River Thames used be a dumping ground for sewage? In 1846 the river was narrowed and deepened to increase the tidal flow, helping to push all of the waste into the North Sea!


