	Pupils will learn about the Great plague and the key events during the GFOL. They will learn about Samuel Pepys and his diaries and how they are used to tell us details about the event. They will learn about how London changed following the fire and the influence of the architect Christopher Wren.	Pupils will learn about the UK, its countries and their capital cities. They will describe the position of these places using directional language. Pupils will learn to describe the key human and physical features of these places.	After a recap of Sparkbrook / Birmingham prior knowledge, pupils will go on to learn about the key human and physical features of a variety of locations around the world associated with the habitats of different animals. Pupils will have opportunities to consolidate their locational knowledge of the world.	Pupils will learn about Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale and compare the lives of these historical heroes. Pupils will learn about life during these historical times and how it differs to today.	Pupils will look at the history of chocolate and find out where it originated from. They will then spend time looking at Bournville and the Cadbury family and the impact they had on the local area. Pupils will study the timeline of Cadbury chocolate.	Pupils will visit a seaside area in the UK and research its physical and human features as well as weather patterns and climate.
