Message from the Head of School

Dear parents,

We discussed the concept of **GRATITUDE** this week in celebration assembly, and how our children are so fortunate to have the opportunity to come to school every day and have amazing experiences such as baking cookies, learning swimming, playing TT Rockstars, taking part in enjoyable lessons such as art, PE, science and so much more.

In recent years, I have visited India and other developing areas and met children and families who, unfortunately, have no scope to attend any school. It is a deeply sad situation for millions of children across the world. Our children had the opportunity to reflect on this and think about how we should be grateful for everything we have in and out of school. Parents – please do remind them of this value of **GRATITUDE**.

On a separate note, I want to take a moment to address the issue of term-time leave and its impact on your child's learning and development. We have had a few children missing several days because of unauthorised term-time leave.

Taking time off during the school term can significantly affect not only academic progress, but also social and emotional growth. Missing school can lead to gaps in essential knowledge and can hinder your child's ability to form strong friendships, which are crucial at this stage in their development.

Please note that school policy requires us to follow local authority procedures regarding term-time leave, which may result in fines for families who take their children out of school without permission. We encourage all parents to prioritise school attendance to ensure your child can thrive in a stable and consistent learning environment.



The foodbank offers help to local people in crisis, who are often referred by specialist agencies such as social services, GP surgeries, schools, care centres and probation teams. We would be grateful if your child could bring in any of the following, to help with our collection for this worthwhile cause.

In-date tinned and packaged food, including:

baby food; tinned meat and fish;








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
