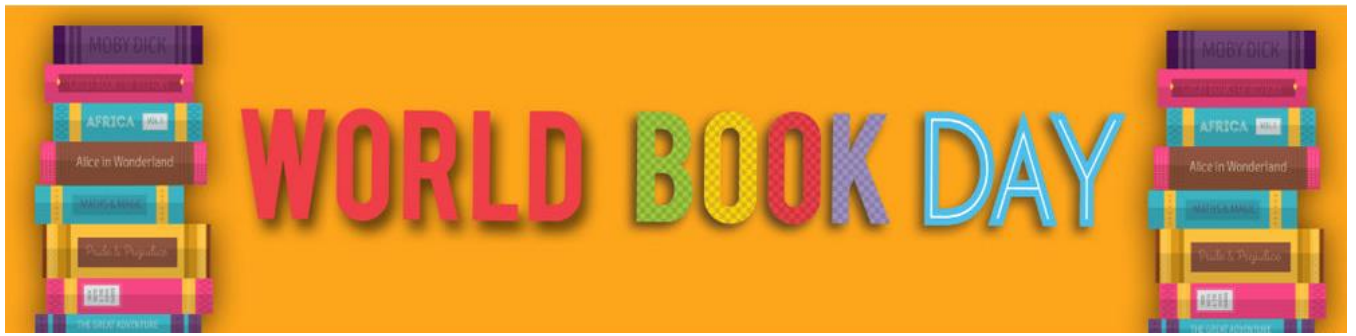

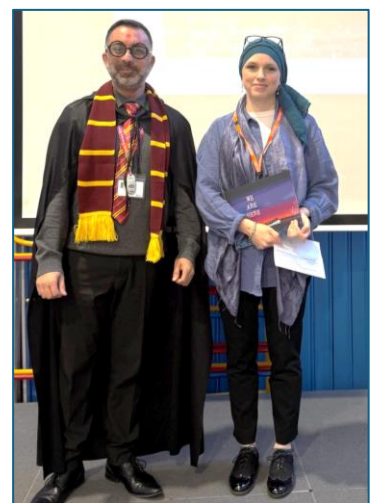

Safeguarding

While some children in school are fasting during this holy month of Ramadan, please do look out for signs of dehydration so that you are able to support your children effectively.

Is your child DEHYDRATED?



Children can easily become dehydrated, **especially if**

they are active when it's hot. Illnesses can also cause dehydration. Here are symptoms parents may not notice, but mean their child is dehydrated:

Dry sticky mouth

Complaining of a stomach ache

Little or no urine output
Dark colored urine

Craving sweets

Crying without tears



How to avoid dehydration

Depending on their age, a child should be drinking between one and two liters of water a day, or between five and seven glasses. Of course, if it's hot, or they are active, that amount needs to be increased."
