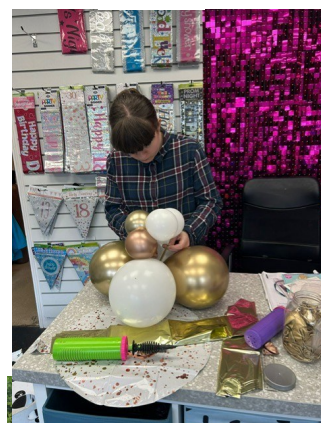
## Busy, Busy, Busy

On Tuesday in Forest School students in Rosewood enjoyed creating pieces of art work using hammers and leaves.

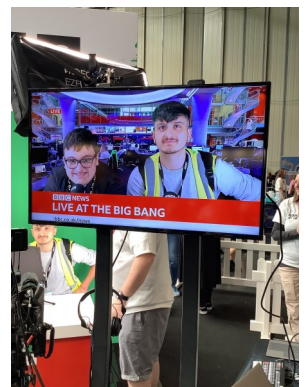


## Big Bang

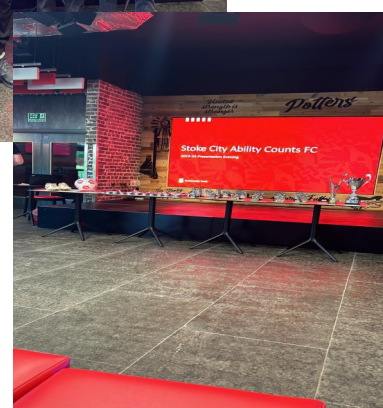
This is an in-school event; unfortunately we don't have the capacity to invite parents/carers to this event.
