
Dear Parents / Carers

As we move towards week 7 of lock-down I really hope that you and your loved ones are keeping well and are staying safe in these difficult times. Working and learning from home as a family has its challenges and it is understandable that this can be hard for many with the novelty of being at home starting to wear off. School continues to be closed to all but vulnerable and key worker children with a small number of staff to supervise each day. The advice remains in place for you to keep your children at home whenever possible.

Staff continue to work hard to support learning. I trust that you have been able to access google classroom which provides a great platform for the children to complete work and the class teacher is able to comment. The 'stream' allows children to keep in touch with each other. Feedback from families has been very positive and children are enjoying having a dialogue with their teacher.

I also appreciate that there may be difficulties in completing some of the work when multiple people in the same household are competing for the same equipment. This is why we have not specified a particular time of day to be doing any of the work. The priority is that our children remain engaged in some form of learning, keep a structure to their day, continue to read for pleasure and have daily exercise and fresh air. At times like this, whenever possible, there is much to be gained from spending time together as a family.

I am sure your children are filled with questions about the current situation, the who, what, where and why questions. Here is a book which has recently been launched which may help you and your child answer some of those questions!



This a FREE digital information book for primary school age children to help explain the coronavirus and the measures taken to control it. It answers lots of questions in a child-friendly way, and aims to both inform and reassure. Published by Nosy Crow and illustrated by Axel, the text had expert input from Professor Graham Medley of the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, and also two headteachers and a child psychologist. 
There are many other daily worship clips you can share with your children.
