Please find information listed about the curriculum which will be taught throughout this half term.

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English	Reading This half term we will be focusing on the story of 'The Robot and the Bluebird'. We will be continuing to look closely at the characters, vocabulary and answering comprehension questions based on what has been read and finding evidence in the text to support reasons.  Writing In writing, we will be continuing with using different sentence types in our writing, using varying punctuation with accuracy and editing our work to ensure that it makes sense independently. We will be continuing to look at prefixes and suffixes and using expanded noun phrases to improve our vocabulary and writing. We will be looking closely at applying our spelling rules learnt in Phonics such as using contracted forms and using the correct prefixes for tenses.  Phonics The children will continue to learn the Year 2 spelling rules using the correct suffixes for tenses and word types, doubling	Home reading Please can we ask that the children aim to read for around 10-20 minutes each night whether it is their school book, home book or even a magazine. Each time the children read a full book, and their book has been signed, they will receive a star in their monkey book. Every 10 books, the children will receive a dip in the box.  Spellings Please encourage your child to review the spelling lists in their books using the look, cover, write, check method throughout the week. Spellings will be stuck in their books on a Monday morning and will be applied throughout the week in their learning.

Homework This half term, reading comprehension homework and Maths will continue to be sent home to develop reading and questioning skills. If your child is struggling, please just write a note in their book, do not let them become stressed by it. We can help in school ©
Maths	This half term we will begin by looking at <b>Statistics-</b> gathering information and using tally charts, pictograms and block graphs to record results. We will look at interpreting the information and reading keys worth more than one. They will then move on to look at the topic of <b>Position and Direction-</b> involving using positional language, describing turns to the left and right as well fractions of turns.	Maths at home! Any support at home with the topics outlined here will be invaluable e.g. reinforcing concepts, posing problems for your child to work out, asking them to explain a mathematical term, spotting opportunities to calculate, paying for the shopping etc.

		Times Tables Rockstars  Each child has been provided with a log in for Times Tables Rockstars, it should be stuck inside their reading record.  Children will be expected to know their 2,3,5 and 10 times tables by the end of KS1 so this app is a brilliant and fun way to help them learn them. The children have been introduced to it at school so should be able to log in and carry on with their sessions.
R.E	Our focus this half term is 'Baptism'. We will be looking closely at the celebration of Baptism, special objects that are related to Baptism, discussing where we belong and also the welcoming ceremonies of other religions also.	If anyone has any photographs or special objects from their Baptism please could you send a copy in or email a photograph to Mrs Cook so that these can be discussed and displayed this half term.
Computing	This half term we will be following the Teach Computing scheme and will be looking at <b>Digital Painting.</b> We will be looking closely at using different programmes to create digital paintings, focusing on selecting the correct tools, adding shapes and lines, making changes and reviewing their work.	
Science	This half-term's topic is 'Seasonal Changes'. This unit is based upon understanding the changes that we start to see from Spring to Summer. We will investigate the changes that we can see occurring on our school grounds and compare to images we have found throughout the year. This half term we will be focusing on the weather and carrying out investigations.	Please could you ensure that the children always keep a pair of wellies in school because we will be outside as much as possible for all subjects as part of our outdoor learning. Thank you
PSHE	Our focus for this half term is How do we recognise our feelings? We will be looking closely at naming, recognising and describing a variety of different emotions and feelings. We will discuss how these emotions make us feel on the inside and how we can control our emotions in certain situations. We will look at gathering strategies to deal with our feelings and identify people we can go to if we need help with our feelings.	
History	This half term our focus is <b>History</b> and we will be looking closely on Significant Individuals, studying <b>Mary Seacole</b> . Maple class will be studying the early life of Mary Seacole and looking at how she went on to be a nurse. We will look at some of the	

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	brilliant things that she did as well as comparing her life as a nurse with that of other famous nurses.	
Design Technology	Our focus for this half term is <b>DT</b> . We will be looking closely at <b>Structures</b> . Maple class will begin by discussing what a structure is and looking at a variety of different structures. We will then look at how structures can be free-standing and will investigate how to create free-standing structures using different materials and joining methods before designing and creating a final product.	
P.E.	In PE, we will be continuing to look at Athletics. We will look at developing our skills of sprinting for races, throwing to reach a goal or target and also jumping for distance from a standing position. We will also be looking at Fundamental Movement Skills developing our control and accuracy when running, throwing, catching, jumping and skipping and assessing their skills.	PE days are Tuesdays and Thursdays. Please ensure that the children have their P.E. bags in school each week. P.E. uniform should consist of black shorts (indoors) or leggings/joggers (for outdoor lessons), white t-shirt and pumps (indoors) or trainers (for outdoors).
		PE will commence w/c 17th June 2024.
Music	Maple Class will be following the Lancashire Music Scheme and will be looking at-Let's Perform Together. The children will listen to and respond to a range of songs and pieces of music, discussing musical genres, notes and tempo. We will look at performing, using our voices accurately and rehearsing a final piece.	

## Other Useful Information

## <u>Equipment</u>

Just a reminder about equipment. Children may bring to school:

- A small book bag and packed lunch box.
- No pencil cases please stationery will be provided.
- A small, named bottle of plain water
- A healthy snack e.g. fruit, cereal bar- no nuts please due to allergies in school.
- A change of footwear e.g. trainers, pumps, wellies (can be kept in school in a named string/carrier bag)

Please ensure children are in full school uniform, with no jewellery (apart from a watch if they wear one). Please label all items clearly with your child's name, especially cardigans and jumpers!

Children need to keep a PE kit in school on their named peg, as they will now be getting changed in school for their PE lessons. Maple class's PE days are – **Tuesdays and Thursdays**.
