


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Mission (10th - 14th November)

I am grateful for all I have and praise God for all he has given me.



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Remembrance Celebration

This week, our Year 3 and 4 children led a thoughtful and moving Remembrance Celebration of the Word. The children spoke with great reverence as they reminded us of the importance of remembering those who fought and sacrificed during times of war. The whole school joined together for a two-minute silence, reflecting on the courage and sacrifice of those who served and giving thanks for the freedoms we enjoy today. Our celebration concluded with a beautiful song, shared by the children, carrying a heartfelt message of peace. It was a truly special moment of unity and reflection for our school community.







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In **Reception** we have been learning all about Diwali, the festival of lights. We watched videos about families celebrating Diwali and the children made their own diva lamps using clay. They made cards and have coloured in rangoli patterns and even tried making their own using rice and 2D shapes. During our English lessons the children heard about the story of Rama and Sita and together acted out the story.













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Treasure Within - A Theatre Adventure with Rise Theatre Company

Last Friday, our school welcomed the Christian **Rise Theatre Company** for their inspiring and interactive production, "*Treasure Within*." This unique **theatre adventure and treasure hunt experience** took our children on a journey to discover **seven of the principles of Catholic Social Teaching** — exploring how these treasures can be found in unusual places and discovering how each one can be applied in daily life.

Armed with a *modern treasure map* (a tablet!) - the child invited the whole school to join the adventure, searching for these treasures in some unexpected places such as a **junk shop**, **library**, **science museum**, and even through **encounters with familiar saints**.

Through a wonderful mix of **drama, storytelling, songs and prayer**, the children learned that everyone has special gifts and talents — each person is **unique, valued because we are all made in the image of God**. The day encouraged the children to reflect on their own "treasures within" and how they can use them to make a positive difference in the world.

It was an unforgettable experience filled with learning, laughter, and **faith** — reminding everyone to look for the *treasures within* themselves and that we are all called to share our treasures with others!






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This week in Provision Class, we explored all things
Autumn! The children used real leaves and clay to make adorable hedgehogs. Such a fun way to strengthen fine motor skills while getting creative!





The children have also thoroughly enjoyed exploring the different areas of provision, where they have created models, practised counting, produced drawings, and completed a variety of puzzles.







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The children in **Year 4** have been taking part in a series of wonderful art lessons. They began by researching the famous English artist William Morris, discovering that he was not only an artist but also a poet and a politician. The children explored his artwork and learned how he drew inspiration from the natural world to create textiles, wallpaper, furniture, and stained glass windows featuring beautiful, repeated patterns.









The children then used a viewfinder to select a section of a William Morris design to create their own repeating patterns by. They worked in their sketchbooks before making a print block of their chosen design using safe print. Finally, they produced their own William Morris-inspired repeating patterns, taking their colour inspiration from the natural world.


