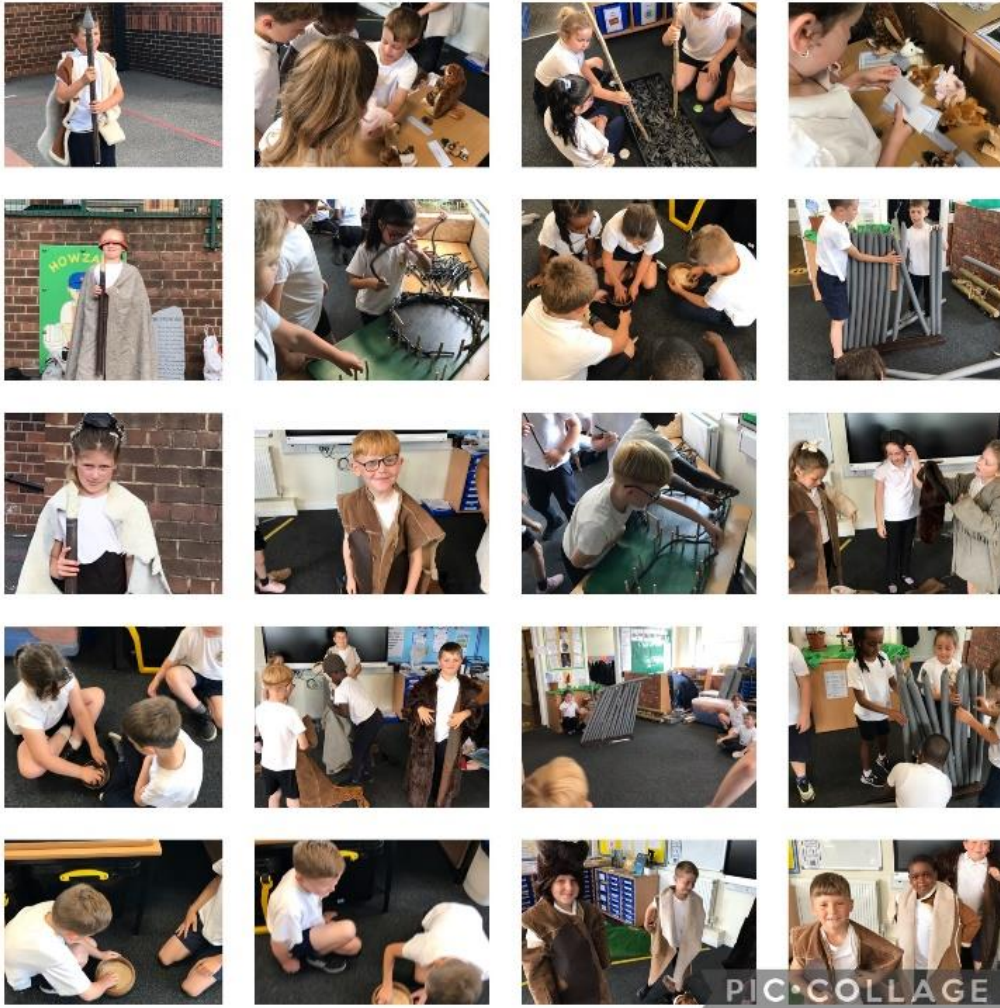
### Covid Testing:

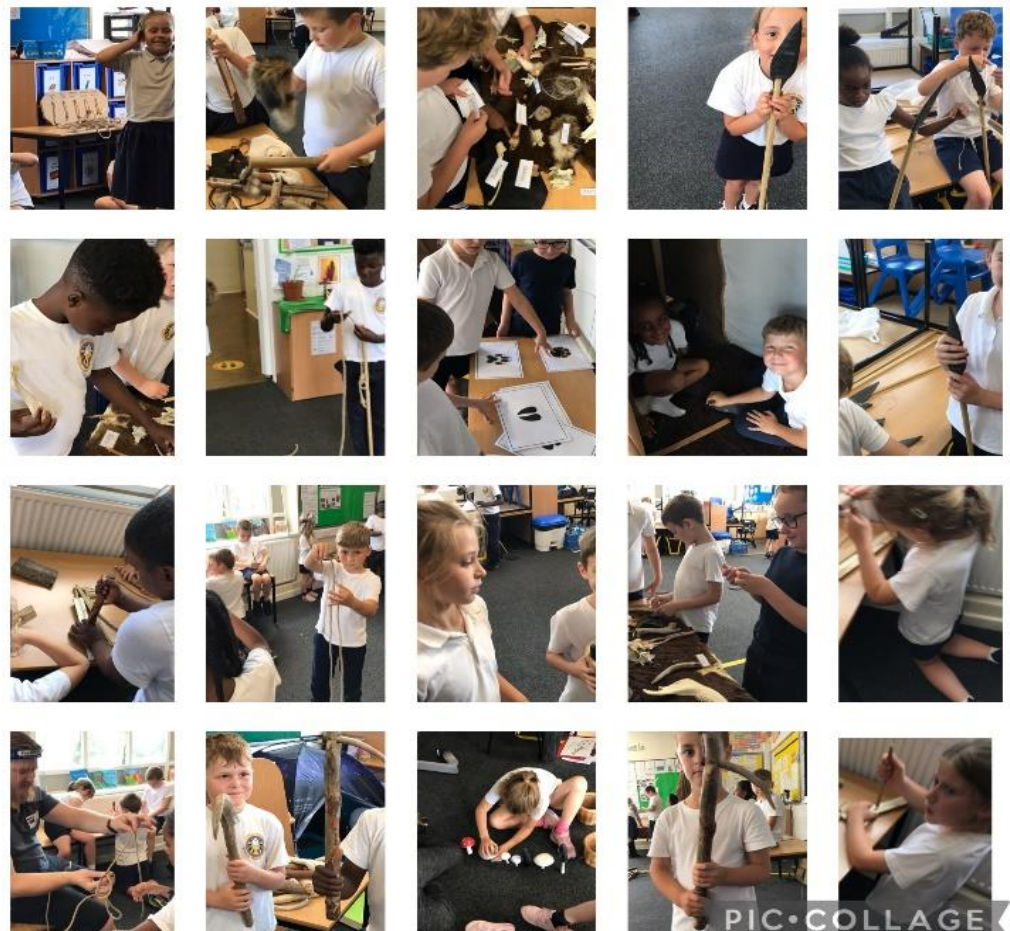
**Pupils with any of these symptoms MUST still take a PCR test at a testing centre.**

Everyone had a great deal of fun dressing as Stone Age people, building a 'School Henge', hunting and tracking animals, as well as making their own tools and flour for bread.





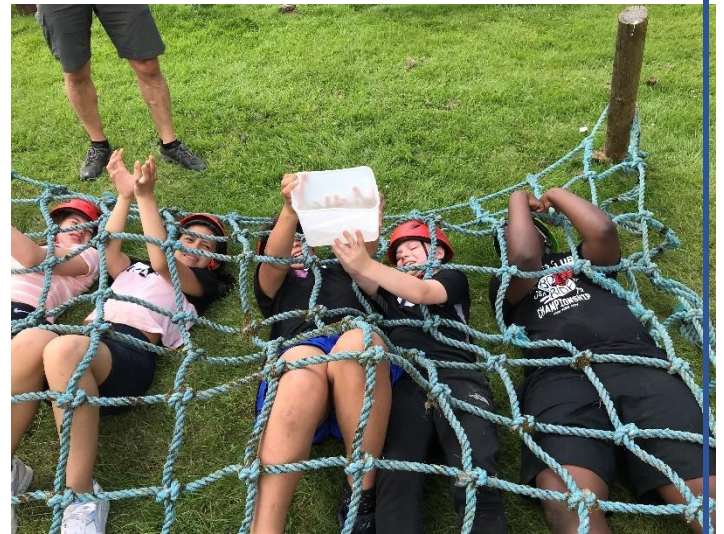
## Classroom Kitchen – Apple Sponge

Year 4 worked in pairs to make an apple sponge cake. First, we measured out our ingredients of butter, sugar and flour. Then, we creamed the butter and sugar together, adding in vanilla extract to flavour our cake. After that, we beat in 3 eggs and folded in the flour. Our next step was to thinly slice the apples and layer them on the bottom of our cake tin. We poured golden syrup on top of the apples to add sweetness to the cake. Finally, we poured the cake mix on top of the sliced apples and baked it in the oven for 35 minutes.
