



Two new saints to inspire us!

On Sunday 7th September 2025, the Church celebrated the canonisation of Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati, two young men from Italy whose lives continues to inspire people of all ages. These are the first saints canonised by Pope Leo.



Carlo was born in London in 1991 but grew up in Milan. He was an ordinary boy who enjoyed playing soccer, video games, and spending time with friends. However, what made him extraordinary was the way he placed God at the centre of his life. From a very young age, he showed a deep love for God. He often said that "the Eucharist is my highway to Heaven" and made time to attend daily Mass and pray the Rosary. Living in the modern digital age, Carlo used technology to spread the Good News and share his faith with others. He also showed kindness to those who were lonely, defended classmates who were bullied, and shared his joy and faith generously. At the age of just 15, Carlo was

diagnosed with an aggressive form of leukaemia. Even in his illness, he remained full of trust in God, offering his suffering for the Pope and for the Church. He died in 2006, but his witness of faith and hope has continued to spread across the world.

St. Pier Giorgio Frassati, the other saint canonised on Sunday, lived from 1901-1925, when he died at age 24 of polio. He was a big fan of mountaineering and often climbed mountains with his friends. He was a good swimmer and athlete He was also a young Italian Catholic who loved helping others. St Pier Giorgio cared deeply about social justice, which is about making sure everyone is treated fairly. He joined groups like Catholic Action and the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul. These groups helped poor and struggling people in his hometown of Turin, Italy. He used his strong faith to serve those in need. People remembered him for his kindness and friendly nature.



God our Father, we thank you for your gift of saints who are models of life for us. We ask that through the intercession of St. Carlo Acutis and St. Pier Giorgio Frassati, we will be inspired to love and serve you with courage and joy. Help us spread the Gospel through our lives so that each of us can be a beacon to light to others.

Well done to our new Reception class0 we are so proud of each and every one of you!































Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400

If you get Working Tax Credit, your child will not qualify for free school meals.

Children who are eligible for a free school meal can also get a free carton of milk.

Even if your child has the universal free school meal offer for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, please apply for this benefit. The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child. Starting Secondary School

Children born between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015.

The application process for the parents of Year 6 pupils to apply on time started on 1st September 2025 and closes on 31st October 2025.
